Sewage closes lake!

Dallas Park and Recreation officials are suspending water-re lated activities at White Rock Lake Park. This decision comes as the City of Plano experiences a sanitary sewage overflow that has affected White Rock Creek and White Rock Lake. To protect public health, park officials advise residents and park visitors not to fish or enter the water because of elevated bacterial levels

found in the creek and lake waters. In addition, recreational boaters and rowing and yacht clubs will discontinue their activities and water operations. Dallas Park and Recreation will remain in communication with Dallas Water Utilities as they actively monitor the water conditions and treatments. As information is received from Dallas Water Utilities, the Park Department will post regular updates regarding when water-related activities can resume. Baseball season begins while America sleeps

While you were sleeping, you may have missed that the 2024 MLB baseball season is officially underway. The Los Angeles Dodgers faced the San Diego Padres in Seoul, South Korea on March 20 and March 21 at 5 a.m. CDT. There was no need to set an alarm as 2,428 regular season games remain.

The Far East got to see two rival NL west teams play. Los Angeles and San Diego are 120 miles apart and yet they traveled 6,000 miles to face each other. Thank you, MLB, for promoting the already popular baseball in South Korea.

In previewing the National League, the Dodgers opened their massive vault in the offseason and filled Chavez Ravine with free agent signings like the amazing

Shohei Ohtani, prized Japanese pitcher Yoshinobu Yamamoto and outfielder Teoscar Hernandez. Via trade, they also added Tyler Glasnow to join Mookie Betts and Freddie Freeman.

Ohtani signed the richest contract in baseball history at \$700 million. That's 935 billion South Korean Won in case Ohtani needs to convert USD at the airport currency exchange kiosk. Baseball's star power is in Hollywood in 2024, and anything less than 102 wins would be considered a flop.

FOR THE LOVE OF THE ANIMALS

Springtime means slithering creatures emerge

My dog was bitten by a snake 15 years ago, and I still remember the scary experience vividly. Snowie was digging under the house, clearly in pursuit of a critter. Suddenly he yelped, ran inside, and hid under the bed. His face swelled up within minutes, and Snowie was so uncomfortable he wouldn't eat a hot dog "pill pocket" (containing medications recommended by our vet). Fortunately, he only needed basic care from our vet, and he recovered quickly.

Spring and summer are prime times to see snakes in your yard or on the hiking trails.

There isn't any common feature shared by all venomous snakes, so you need to be able to recognize the three venomous snake species that

live in North Texas. Copperhead


Copperheads are the

most common venomous snakes found in Dallas. This small snake (20-30 inches long) has a light-colored body with chestnut or reddish-brown crossbands. Two subspecies, the Southern copperhead and Broadbanded copperhead, reside in the area. Fortunately, a copperhead's bite is seldom fatal (to people) because its short fangs (only 1-7 mm long) only contain small amounts of venom.

Rattlesnake

Ten rattlesnake species live in Texas, but the most common and widespread is the Western Diamondback. Western Diamondbacks are pit vipers, meaning they have a heat-sensing pit behind each

SOLAR ECLIPSE

What happens when the light goes out?

Early next month, on April 8, a select group of Texans and other lucky earthlings standing outside on a 115-mile-wide strip of real estate stretching from Mexico up through the United States and into Canada will witness Mother Nature's most magnificent magic trick — a total solar eclipse.

Stay safe

As friends and family gear up and get together to share one of the most mesmerizing spectacles the universe has to offer, the experts are urging people to take the time to keep everyone safe by following a few simple guidelines.

The best advice for planning a great eclipse experience comes straight from the scientists at the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA). NASA experts emphasize the use of solar glasses as the number one safety measure for every participant.

These experts point out that looking directly at the sun for any length of time can cause irreversible harm — so safety lenses are mandatory for enjoying this experience. What's more, looking at the sun through a camera lens, a telescope or binoculars without a filter specifically made for solar viewing will immediately injure the eyes.

To find a selection of safe viewing equipment, check out the American Astronomical Society's online approved list of options for solar lenses. Dallas schools will provide safety lenses for their students to use during the eclipse.

Eclipses change behavior A total eclipse produces unusual behavior in animals.



Bees stop flying and go absolutely silent when the moon blocks the sun and blackens the sky.

Owls, on the other hand, become more active during an eclipse. They are nocturnal, so when it goes dark, they become alert, hooting and gathering, and when it goes bright again, they accept that it's daytime once more and go back to sleep.

So many people are making plans to be where they can watch this phenomenon, it might seem odd that eclipses could stir fear in people. The ancient Greeks thought they were evil, serving as bad omens from the gods. But in one instance, the eclipse had such a powerful, chilling effect, it elicited a surprise ceasefire during a war, interrupting a major battle and changing history.

As Herodotus, the historian, documents, soldiers at the Battle of Halys, at around 585 B.C. were at war with each other over a dispute about who could lay claim to an area of land that is now part of Turkey. Both sides of the dispute were so

overwhelmed by the eclipse, they felt certain that what they had witnessed came directly from the gods and was meant to serve as a command for them to stop fighting. Both sides laid down their arms and worked out a truce.

A chilling event

The eclipse will also be ushered in by a sudden lowering of the temperature. Weather forecasters are predicting that there may be as much as a 10-degree cool-off as the sun is blocked out.

Changing places

Many local areas expect a huge number of visitors for this event. The city of Ennis expects as many as 250,000 visitors, enough to warrant special levels of preparation. In fact, some counties in Texas expect their populations to double overnight, or maybe even triple, mandating readiness at massive levels.

Bell, San Saba and Kerr counties are also located in prime viewing areas. Officials there are expecting such huge numbers of visitors that they are treating it as an emergency. They are further urging residents to, if possible, avoid

driving at all, refill prescriptions prior to the eclipse, fill up their cars and make sure they have enough food for a few days.


Another crucial safety aspect of the eclipse will occur AFTER the sun reappears. This same thing happens on Friday nights in Texas when the high school football game is over: A MEGA TRAFFIC JAM. The Texas Department of Transportation is considering the likelihood that eclipse events could snarl traffic up considerably.

The unpredictability of this once-in-a-lifetime local event has only one certainty: have a backup plan for EVERYTHING.

Take the day off

The fact that the eclipse could seriously impact traffic and other local activities makes one recent Letter to the Editor suggestion a good idea: the day of the eclipse should be designated a school holiday.

Under Counsell's council, Cubs fans hope the team plays better than .500 ball.

But this is Baseball is a a mediocre game of traditions. team that

did little in the off-season except keep CF Cody Bellinger. Another average team, the Cincinnati Reds, will play without team leader Joey Votto for the first time since 2007.

The team has young Spencer Steer, TJ Friedl (currently out with a broken wrist), Jonathan India, Matt McLain and Elly De La Cruz. The Pittsburgh Pirates are still retooling, but now have hitters Ke'Bryan Hayes, Bryan Reynolds and Jack Suwinski and pitcher Mitch Keller in place. this year.

The St. Louis Cardinals are coming off a miserable fifth place finish. But they added pitchers Sonny Gray, Kyle Gibson and Lance Lynn to stalwarts Paul Goldschmidt and Nolan Arenado. The 2023 Cardinals

were an aberration. The 2024 squad will win the NL Central.

In the NL East, the Atlanta Braves and Philadelphia Phillies are ready to continue a battle that began in 2023. The Braves won the division, and then the Phillies knocked them out of the playoffs. The Braves, with MVP Ronald Acuña Jr., are even better in 2024, adding starter Chris Sale. The Phillies just want to stay healthy. A full season from Bryce Harper solidifies a lineup with Kyle Schwarber, Trea Turner, Nick Castellanos and J.T. Realmuto and makes the Phils a Wild Card team.



In fact, some Dallas school districts will be closing on April 8, the day of the eclipse. That being said, and Texas being Texas, most students are NOT likely to get the day off. But students in class that day can expect, with the cooperation of the typically good Texas weather in April, a real-life demonstration of geometry in

action. The geometry of it all depends on several important factors that just happen to

combine in a specific manner that in the end produces a solar eclipse. Those factors include a moon that orbits its planet at just the right distance to block off every ray of sunshine from the sun when the moon's orbit positions it at the critical angle between the earth and the sun.

People standing on Earth, in the moon's shadow, can enjoy the experience of watching the sun disappear behind the moon while marveling at the swirl of solar flares bursting from the sun's corona from behind their solar glasses.

nostril that can detect differences (even small ones) in temperature.

The snake detects the heat given off by an animal, helping it distinguish between predators and prey. Western Diamondbacks are three to five feet long, with a triangular shaped head, dark diamond-shaped patterns along their back, and black and white bands on the tail, just above the rattles.

Coral Snake

This brightly colored snake is very shy and non-aggressive. However, coral snakes can still cause a serious bite if they're handled. Coral snakes are about two and a half feet long, with red, yellow and black bands completely encircling their body. A harmless snake, the Scarlet snake, also has red, yellow and black bands. To tell the difference, remember this rhyme: "Red next to black friend of Jack; red next to yellow will kill a fellow." Coral snakes have red bands next to yellow ones; Scarlet snakes have red bands next to black (not yellow).

What to Do if You Spot a Snake

Stop moving and allow the snake to retreat. Snakes

don't prey on people, and they won't chase you. Instead, they retreat or escape when they can. Venomous snakes are dangerous when they are surprised or cornered. Most bites occur because people take foolish risks with venomous

snakes. If you must move when you see a snake, back slowly and carefully away from the reptile.

Do not kill the snake. Snakes serve a valuable function in the environment, eating rats and mice that

spread disease and damage property. Snakes also control the tick population by eating the animals that harbor them. Leave snakes, even venomous ones, alone.

Don't play with (or allow your dog to play with) a dead

snake. Dead snakes have been known to bite and inject venom because of muscle contractions.

Contact a humane wildlife control company to remove the live snake, if necessary. AnimalHelpNow is a free app that lists resources for dealing with wildlife, including snakes. Go to the Wildlife Conflict section, which includes two Dallasarea companies:

Bitten by a Snake Go immediately to an emergency care facility (emergency room or clinic). If possible, identify the snake so you can tell the doctor, who will provide the right antivenom.

Stay calm and limit physical exertion. Remove all jewelry (bracelets, watches, rings) and restrictive clothing near the bite so these items don't restrict blood flow if swelling occurs.

Avoid "home remedy" treatments. They are not helpful and may do more harm than good. Forget everything you've seen in movies and TV sitcoms.

• Do NOT apply ice to the bite.

• Do NOT make a

tourniquet.

• Do NOT make any in-

cision on or near the bite. What to Do if Your Dog is Bitten by a Snake (Venomous or Not)

The most common signs of a snake bite include swelling, bruising and pain at the site of the bite. If your dog was bitten by a venomous snake, extensive swelling spreads rapidly, and you'll see bloody discharge at the bite site. The toxin will often lead to shock.

Take your dog to the veterinarian immediately, whether she was bitten by a venomous or non-venomous snake. Depending on the snake/bite, your vet will treat the wound, administer antibiotics and pain medication, give an antivenom (if needed) and treat the side effects (shock and organ compromise).

On the way to the vet, keep the bitten area lower than the heart, if possible. This slows the spread of the toxin. And keep your dog (and yourself) calm.

Avoid first aid remedies before going to the vet. They are not helpful. The best approach is to seek immediate vet attention.

Keep these tips in mind as you enjoy outdoor activities this spring.
