Each week, the Dans la rue team takes to the streets in their bus to distribute some 1,000 to 1,800 hot dogs to homeless youth in Montréal and offer them a place to warm up, an open ear and the support they need. As a temporary break from the street, the bus is a gateway to the organization's services, and a first step in the lengthy process of building trust with marginalized youth.

Every Wednesday from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. at the Day Centre, Dans la rue welcomes groups of 6 to 10 people to help assemble and package around 1,000 hot dogs ahead of the bus's evening outing. At the end of the activity, the group has the opportunity to visit the Day Centre.
