HSS has received visionary support of \$10 million from Lizzie and Jonathan Tisch to support HSS expansion and construction of the Kellen Tower, the centerpiece of our main campus transformation into a hub for complex care. In addition to clinical and physician practice spaces, the Kellen Tower will have 36 private inpatient rooms on three specialized floors. The fifth floor of the new building will be named Tisch 5 in recognition of their incredible commitment. Tisch 5 will house 11 private rooms with special amenities

and detailed finishes to make the patient healing experience unique.



Expanding Our Reach: HSS Florida

The first HSS Florida location opened in West Palm Beach in 2020 to meet the needs of a growing community of patients from across South Florida and all over the Southern U.S. Since then, HSS in West Palm Beach has become the preferred destination for top-quality, comprehensive musculoskeletal services in sports medicine, joint replacement, hand and upper extremity, physiatry, radiology, and trauma, handling more than 20,000 office visits and 12,000 rehabilitation visits last year.

Earlier this year, healthcare leader Tara McCoy was appointed as HSS Florida CEO to oversee strategy and growth for the region. Plans include expanding clinical and administrative spaces and recruiting world-class talent in primary sports medicine and spine surgery and other areas to ensure that the best in all orthopedic specialties can be found in Palm Beach County. And HSS recently announced a partnership with Naples Community Healthcare System to establish a new hub for care on the west coast of Florida that will open there in 2025.

In addition to expanding the clinical team, HSS Florida is growing its research enterprise to generate new knowledge to improve care. Our team is advancing investigations in areas such as robotics in joint replacements, wearable technology to monitor progress after surgery, and new surgical techniques to bring leading-edge treatment to patients. These efforts underscore our commitment to improving the health and vitality of the entire Florida community and beyond.

Celebrating 20 Years of the Greenberg Center for Skeletal Dysplasias

Since 2003, the Kathryn O. and Alan C. Greenberg Center for Skeletal Dysplasias has been an unmatched source of expertise, providing unsurpassed care for patients of all ages with genetic disorders that affect bone and cartilage. Skeletal dysplasia refers to more than 400 genetic conditions that affect the size and shape of the limbs, trunk, and/or skull. Many people with a skeletal dysplasia have disproportionate short stature and can have various orthopedic problems, such as fractures because of brittle bones.

The extraordinary partnership of HSS Life Trustee Kathryn Greenberg and her late husband, Alan, made this Center possible. It is the only comprehensive medical center in the Northeast that treats patients across their lifetime, from infancy to adulthood. Since its inception, the Center's multidisciplinary team has delivered ongoing, vital care to more than 800 people, and continues to improve their quality of life through research, education, and patient advocacy.
