PA WILDS CARAVAN

Traveling with eight rigs, we began our journey at **Parker Dam State Park**. This park is close to well-known areas for elk viewing during the rut, home of the Elk Visitor Center outside the town of Benezette. We saw and heard elk bugling, took a wagon ride deeper into the area, and drove to other viewing points laid out on an elk scenic drive. The park ranger, Eric, gave us a talk and a walkabout of the history and environment of Parker Dam and the logging history. The weather was cold but clear, and the trees were showing off their autumn colors. Our group of 13 people enjoyed good food, warm campfires, and relaxing hikes.

Our second stop was **Sinnemahoning State Park**. Here we took a group hike on the Fred Woods Trail to experience the overviews. The weather changed quickly with brisk winds, so our pontoon ride was cancelled. We decided to visit the Wildlife Center and got an impromptu talk on owls and owl calls. Then a ranger presented a program on the Pepper Hill Fires. A long yet informative day.



The third stop was to **Cherry Springs State Park** to see a dark sky under a new moon. We were lucky to get one of the three nights we spent there to witness a dark sky. We saw the Milky Way and a comet, along with more stars than you can count. The next day, we had a group tour of the Lumber Museum: a beautifully done building and a great insight into the lumber and logging industry.



The last stop was to **Leonard Harrison State Park** to view PA's Grand Canyon and bike ride the Pine Creek Rail Trail. Chili cook-off, dinner, and a "concert", ranger talk, and hikes were all part of the plan for this park. Of course, on our departure day, the sun came out so we could bike and then hook up and say our goodbyes.

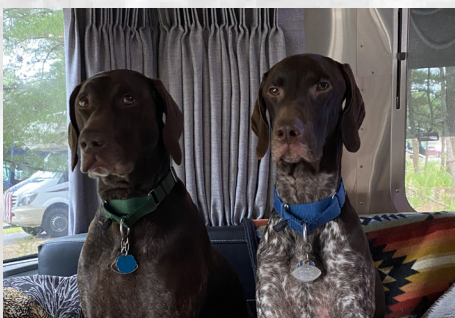
