the Asylum Seeker Resource Centre in the finance department. That was really helpful when I applied for jobs – having those references and experience was really good.



THE INNOVATE BUSINESS GROWTH PROGRAM 2023

Wyndham City will be again delivering another edition of the free Innovate Business Growth Program. After the successful changes which took place this year, Council recognises that businesses at different stages of their journey may have different needs and that is why the Innovate program will continue to be split into two streams!

This Program will again be a mixture of group workshops which provides an opportunity to share experiences and build relationships with other local businesses and one-to-one mentoring from business coaches. The Innovate Business Growth program consists of the Innovate to Excelerate and Innovate to Regenerate streams.

The Innovate to Excelerate - Business Growth Program is aimed for those business owners to move up a level in 2023, find new directions, build new skills, extend business relationships and gain growth. This could be the right decision at the right time. Expectations are that the year ahead will challenge emerging businesses to find new ways to build capacity, performance and competitive advantage. This program is open for businesses that have operated for less than four years.

The Innovate to Regenerate Program targets those Wyndham businesses that have operated for longer and are at a later stage in their business journey. If you have experienced strong initial growth in your business but are facing challenges in taking your small to medium business to the next level or looking for creative ways on how to take it there, this is the program for you.

These programs consist of group sessions and individual business coaching. Adrian Jobson and his team from Acculture will be facilitating the Innovate to Excelerate program. The Regenerate program will be led by Brad Regan from Real Edge in Business and his team of experts.

BUSINESS OPPORTUNITIES IN THE \$270M WYNDHAM LAW COURTS PROJECT



ICN Victoria is working with Court Services Victoria (CSV) and the recently announced project owners to deliver a new state-of-the-art court precinct for Melbourne's rapidly growing western corridor.

The future Wyndham Law Courts is a major government project, worth over \$270M and brings together multiple Victorian court jurisdictions and tribunals in the largest precinct outside of metropolitan Melbourne.

Located adjacent to the new Werribee Police Station, the court will be built on vacant land purchased with 2018/2019 state budget funding. The future Wyndham Law Courts will improve safety and accessibility and increase the range of justice services and programs delivered in the West. The court complex is due to be completed by late 2024 with doors set to open in early 2025.






Healthy Aging Program. They also work and support local sporting teams and Mackillop College.

TRADING THE CORPORATE WORLD TO START HIS OWN GARLIC BUSINESS



Tadhg Knaggs did a complete 180 when he made the life-changing decision to leave behind his unfulfilling office job to start a community-grown, chemical-free garlic business just north of regional foodie capital, Kyneton.

Being made redundant during the COVID-19 pandemic pushed him to take a chance on his passion for farming. Thanks to the support of Asuria, Tadhg is now a full-time business owner and has been operating the Knagwood Garlic Farm for over a year. This family-run garlic farm uses regenerative agricultural practices to build soil.

"I think COVID-19 just put into perspective for me that the world can change in an instant. I have always been passionate about growing organic garlic, and the mentoring program gave me the opportunity to explore that," said Tadhg.

Asuria's Workforce Australia - Self-Employment Assistance program provides Australians with the opportunity to turn their passions into professions. During the small business coaching, participants are encouraged by their business mentors to develop a strong business plan. This includes twelve months of support for their new business venture, including income support.

The mentoring program allowed Tadhg to gain professional advice from Asuria's Business Mentor Ramesh, who guided Tadhg on how to turn

growing garlic a profitable business all year round. Throughout the training, Tadhg found one-on-one coaching the most beneficial, alongside the opportunity to learn and grow with the other participants.

Although initially nervous about launching, the ongoing support from Asuria's Business Mentors has given him all the confidence that leaving the corporate world for farming was absolutely the right call.

"Anyone who has started a business knows that there is always some doubt in the back of your mind. I was taking a big risk leaving my old career for something completely different but having wise mentors believe in me and overseeing my progress made the process enjoyable and much less daunting than if I were to do it all alone." Tadhg said.

VEGETABLES MADE IN WYNDHAM



The story of **Mason Bros Vegetable Farms** started when Romano Mason emigrated to this country in the sixties and began working on the farm with his three brothers that were already here. In 1976, they bought 50 acres of land in Werribee South to start their own farming business. His sons, Marco and Amo, joined the business and now manage the day-to-day farm operations from marketing to crop growth and ground work. Even though Romano has retired from growing crops, he is still working in the business sharing his passion and ingenuity - designing, building and maintaining its machinery.

Mason Bros has continued to invest not just in machinery and equipment to make the business more automated and efficient but also in size. Thanks to the hard work and effort of the family, Mason Bros grew their farms to a total of 500 acres of land located in Werribee South and Balliang. Through the consistent supply of irrigation water from Melbourne Water that provides up to 11,000 megalitres of recycled water to the Werribee South farming community each year, they are able to produce crops all year round - transforming a seed to a crop. The business is an industry leader in the production of iceberg lettuce, broccoli and fennel - a sought after crop due to its size, taste and overall quality.

With their investment in the state-of-art storage facilities including dedicated harvesting and processing equipment, Mason Bros ensures their crops get to the vegetable markets or on supermarket shelves as fresh as they can be. Within 24 hours of being picked up, their crop is available for sale at major fresh fruit and vegetable markets around Melbourne. And in just three days even their Perth customers would be enjoying fresh Wyndham grown produce. Their wholesaler partners are located all over the country from Brisbane, Sydney to Adelaide and Perth.

The importance of Werribee South as a green wedge is to become even more crucial as climate change affect the production of crops around the country. There needs to be protection of the green wedge and continue to encourage agricultural activities. With the next generation of Mason family getting into the business, exciting times do lie ahead to ensure we can continue to enjoy fresh and crisp produce at our table made in Wyndham.







TOTAL EXPORTS BY INDUSTRY 2020/21


