

PASTOR'S GREETING

"Community is a basic need and hunger of the human heart. We are created for community, but often we do not experience it in the individualistic and competitive cultures that shape our lives. Community is a place of acceptance, intimacy and vulnerability, where we can bear fruit in solidarity with others and be the body of Christ for the sake of the world." (Henri Nouwen, Community)

Dear Hamline Church Family,

It's been nearly six decades since the Beatles sang about empty churches and "all the lonely people" who cling to and abandon these ancient institutions. Yet it was just this year Dr. Vivek Murthy, the United States Surgeon General, issued an "Advisory on the Healing Effects of Social Connection and Community" in response to what he has declared "Our Epidemic of Loneliness and Isolation." Here's an excerpt from Dr. Murthy's letter at the beginning of an 82-page document produced by the Public Health Service: People began to tell me they felt isolated, invisible, and insignificant. Even when they couldn't put their finger on the word "lonely," time and time again, people of all ages and socioeconomic backgrounds, from every corner of the country, would tell me, "I have to shoulder all of life's burdens by myself," or "if I disappear tomorrow, no one will even notice."

Friends, this is a world that aches for the Good News. Not a gospel of strong-arming people in to correct dogma or casting judgment. Rather the Gospel that will save souls – right here and now. The world aches for connection, for community, for relationship. The world aches for spaces where we are allowed to show up with our whole selves and find that we are together, seen, and valued. And, the research Dr. Murthy has collected shows pretty convincingly that when humans don't have connection their lives are shorter and worse.

One cure for the loneliness epidemic? Go to church. Or any other faith community, for that matter. Faith communities offer one of the few places left in Western society where people gather across familial, generational, and economic lines outside the trappings of consumerism. The Gospel of Jesus is one of intimate connection – it paints a picture of growing closer to God through a Way that requires the faithful to grow closer to one another. Our Christian calls to worship, to pray, to serve, to do justice... are all calls to build and belong in community.

From the Advisory document I mentioned: "Among people not reporting loneliness or social isolation, nearly 90% have three or more confidants. Yet, almost half of Americans (49%) in 2021 reported having three or fewer close friends —only about a quarter (27%) reported the same in 1990." **Our number of lonely neighbors has almost doubled**. How might we be called to respond? *If community is literally life-saving, what's our next faithful step?*

I believe that Hamline Church already has many gifts to offer as hope filled responses to this challenge, and there is more to be done. In these pages you'll find many invitations and opportunities to engage in the work of being church I hope and pray that you'll join us in the rich sharing of life together. Yet I also know that it is possible to feel lonely within community – if this is you, please reach out to me or Pastor Heather and we can help you find ways to connect. We all feel lonely at times.

In our Annual Giving campaign this November we focus on Releasing God's Blessings - I am grateful for the many ways Hamline Church shares God's blessings to make a difference in the lives of others and our community.

As we enter the holiday season and the holy seasons of All Saints, Advent and Christmas - how are you feeling the Spirit's call to reach out in love to another? Because just maybe when we do, it is possible to find a remedy for our lonely hearts as well.



ADVENT & CHRISTMAS 2023 HOW DOES A WEARY WORLD REJOICE?

Joy is often a companion to many other emotions. We can feel joy in addition to feeling many other things at once: grief, anticipation, anxiety, excitement, disappointment, exhaustion. Perhaps many of us live with the myth that joy is not something we deserve—or that it is wholly out of reach. But our joy is rooted in the truth that we belong to God. Can you tether yourself to that deep truth? You deserve to feel joy—fully. The world needs your joy, even if you are weary. Our joy is better when it is shared.



This theme of course alludes to a line in the familiar Christmas hymn, "O Holy Night," which has an interesting history. The song was originally written by a French poet who was atheist, and the music was supplied by a Jewish composer. The hymn was later translated into English by an American Unitarian minister. In the 1800s, it became a popular hymn for Christian abolitionists due to its justice-focused language in verse 3.3 Like Mary's song, the hymn reminds us that justice and joy belong together. Sometimes our joy is an act of resistance.

And so, this Advent, we will hold space for our weariness and our joy. We will seek a "thrill of hope" in our hurting world. We will welcome joy—even and especially if, like the prophet Isaiah, we cry out for comfort (Isaiah 40:1). In this weary world, may we find many ways to rejoice.


- Membership Inquiry Class and Welcome Meal, Sunday, November 5 from 5-7pm at the Church:

VISIONING PROCESS WITH MINISTRY ARCHITECTS

Join us November 12

At Hamline Church, we're grateful to be part of a community that welcomes and nurtures children, youth, and their families. This year, we're excited to work on a visioning process for our student ministries to ensure that this community has the foundation to continue building on our children and youth ministries, and that they can exist sustainably. To do this work, we're partnering with Ministry Architects, a church consulting company, through next summer.

The first piece of this process is to invite Ministry Architects to join us on November 12 for some listening sessions. They'll spend the majority of their time listening to a variety of groups within the church through focused listening sessions. We hope that we'll have a broad spectrum of parents/caregivers, youth, volunteers, and folks who love our young people participating! We want you to have an opportunity to share your insights, frustrations, and dreams.

After the listening sessions, our consultant will create a report to share with us what they've heard about children and youth ministries, and where God might be leading us next. FAQ FROM MINISTRY ARCHITECTS

Why Ministry Architects?

At Ministry Architects, we believe there is a better way, a better way than one-size-fits-all training events and quick-fix searches for superstar staffers. It all starts with building intentionally. So like architects, we don't tell churches what they want to build. We start by listening and then show them a blueprint of exactly how they can move from where they are to where they want to be. And then we walk alongside them as to make sure that they build the kind of infrastructure they will need to create the children's and youth ministries they dream of having. We have made it our mission to help churches establish sustainable, deep-impact children's and youth ministries, one church at a time.

What is going to happen when Ministry Architects is here?

Ministry Architects will spend the majority of their time listening to a variety of groups within the church through focused listening groups. After spending a day in these listening groups (and taking copious notes), the Ministry Architects team will hunker down to write a report, sharing with the church what they've heard about the children's and youth programs and where they hear that the church wants to go. After that, the report will be presented to the congregation, laying out a blueprint for how to move forward.



As a parent/caregiver, why should I attend?

As a parent/caregiver, you have the strongest influence on your child's spiritual development, and you are the center of faith formation in your family. Ministry Architects wants to hear your hopes, dreams and concerns about the children's and youth ministries. Parents and caregivers can give feedback on how the children's and youth ministries are helping their child/youth to grow into the person that God created them to be. Parents and caregivers are a vital piece to the Christian nurture of their children and Ministry Architects wants them to be invested in the process of building a strong foundation.

As a volunteer, why should I attend?

Volunteers obviously care about the children's and youth ministries through their commitment of time, energy, and love. You can give perspective to how you see the ministry affecting the lives of the children and youth because you are on the "front lines." You can see what the strengths & challenges are and can bring about change and improvement to the ministry in which they are serving. Your feedback is invaluable.

As a church member who is not a part of the children's or youth ministries, why should I attend?

Faith formation is a community effort – it takes many folks to model the Christian life to young people. Members of the church set the example to children and youth on how to worship, how to live a Christ-like life, and how to serve Christ in others. As a member of the church, your feedback is significant in moving the children and youth ministries forward in a sustainable model. As Christians, we are called to nurture faith in our young people. Investing your time in a listening group shows the care that members of the church have for its children and youth. Ministry Architects values the "outside" view that you can give.

What will the report look like?

The Assessment Report will start by reflecting back to the church what the Ministry Architects team heard people saying about the children's and youth ministries. We compare your church to norms across the country. We will point out the assets of the programs – the things to protect and keep. We will also share the challenges that we see – the things that are roadblocks to the ministries moving strategically forward. We then lay out a blueprint for how to strategically move the children's and youth ministries from where they are now to where you want them to be. These recommendations include a detailed timeline laying out the process month by month.

MILESTONES

At Hamline Church, one of the ways we walk alongside our children and their families is through our Faith Milestone Program. Every year, we take a moment to celebrate a milestone in each child's life. Just as throughout the Bible, God's people mark the places where they encounter God with a stone, we present each child with a smooth, cross-embossed stone to mark the occasion. SUNDAY MORNINGS

Sacred Studio is our spiritual formation time for children, prek-6th grade. On Sundays (except for the 1st Sunday of each month) after the children's moment in worship, children can go with staff and volunteers to explore a bible story through art, music, and games. This time is focused on making space for children to know God's love!

- Godly Play: Prek-K children will explore bible stories by building a practice of listening, wondering, and responding through art with this Montessori-based curriculum. Families can decide with their 3 and 4 year-olds when you would like to transition from the Frolic room childcare into Sacred Studio.
- Mini Revolutions: 1st-4th graders will use Illustrated Ministry's "Mini Revolutions" to explore bible stories through discussion, connections to the world, activities, and mini spiritual practices. This group will split into two depending on numbers each week.
- Tween Ducks: 5th and 6th graders will sit together in the worship service along with adult leaders, then gather after the sermon in the youth room to connect and reflect on worship together.

Ring in the Christmas season with the Hamline Church Women! Two of our biggest fundraisers are also the most fun.



NOTE FROM THE ORGANIST

As this newsletter goes to print I am making final selections for Advent preludes and postludes. After selecting music the next important step is deciding which stops to use. The sound makes all the difference, it can make or break the piece!

In elementary school I remember hearing a recording that captured my attention. I wondered what instrument could possibly be playing that beautiful line? It turned out the magical sound was an organ 8 foot flute together with a 2 foot flute playing Bach's lovely Advent piece, Wachet auf. Ever since then I've always felt the 8 and 2 foot flute is one of the magical sounds I like to hear during Advent and Christmas. Whichever pieces make the final cut this year, I expect at least one will have my favorite magical sound!

We have flute stops on each keyboard of our organ at several different pitch levels. Stops that sound at the written pitch are called eight-foot stops, even if their low C is not actually eight feet long. Stops labeled 4' sound an octave higher than written, 2' stops sound two octaves higher and 16' stops sound an octave lower. Just some of the magic of our wonderful Casavant organ!
