

Water Efficiency Rebate Grants are back!

The City of Farmington has a Water Efficiency Rebate Program. The rebate program is made possible through a grant established to encourage water conservation by reducing municipal water use in both residential and commercial properties within the city. The program offers rebates to water customers who replace old, inefficient toilets, washing machines and irrigation systems with WaterSense® and Energy Star® certified appliances and equipment to help conserve water and reduce utility bills.

Rebates are offered for 50% of the pre-tax purchase price of the following items:

- WaterSense® toilets up to \$50
- Energy Star® dish washing machine up to \$150
- Energy Star® clothes washing machines up to \$200
- WaterSense® irrigation controllers up to \$150
- WaterSense® sprinkler head replacement up to \$10 per unit with a max of \$150

Mattress/Box Spring Drop-Off and Document Shred Event

On Saturday, Oct. 15, the city will host a drop-off for mattresses and box springs. The drop-off will be held at the Farmington Maintenance Facility, 19650 Municipal Drive from 8 a.m. to noon. Mattresses and box springs will be accepted for \$25/piece, payable directly to Certified Recycling. We will also have a shred truck on site so bring your confidential documents for shredding! There is no charge to have documents shredded.

If you have hazardous materials and electronics that you need to get rid of, bring them to The Recycling Zone in Eagan year-round. The Recycling Zone is located at 3365 Dodd Road, in Eagan. For more information visit www.dakotacounty.us, search recycling zone.

Election Judges Needed - Sign up by Sept. 12

Interested in learning the voting process and want to serve your community? Sign up to become an election judge! ALL applicants should be comfortable with using an iPad, able to hear in large crowds, eligible to vote in MN, a U.S. citizen and at least age 18. Please see the application for more information. A minimum of two hours of paid training is required and training on voting equipment will also be provided. Voting procedures training will be online; epoll book training will be in person at Farmington City Hall. Election judges can work the entire day (16 hours) or half a day (8 hours) and are paid \$12.50/hour. If you are interested in serving as an election judge, sign-up forms are available on our website FarmingtonMN.gov under Elections, at City Hall, or you may contact Cindy Muller at 651-280-6803 or CMuller@FarmingtonMN.gov. Once you sign up, it is very important that you keep this commitment. Forms are due by Sept. 12.

Candidate Filing - Aug. 2 - 16, 2022

Candidate filing for two City Council seats should be done in person at Farmington City Hall, Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. beginning Aug. 2 and until 5 p.m. on Aug. 16. Pre-Register to Vote

By Oct. 18 for the General Election

Check your voter registration and pre-register at mn.votes.org. Residents are strongly encouraged to pre-register to vote to save time on Election Day. If you have moved since the November 2020 election, have changed your name, or have not voted within the last four years, you will need to register to vote. MOTE: The address on your driver's license should be where you live, **NOT** where you work or where you pick up your mail. Where you vote depends on where your house is physically located and that is the address you need to register under and it should match your drivers license. Residential addresses only will be accepted. Pre-registration can also be done at county offices, drivers' license centers or Farmington City Hall. The deadline is Oct. 18 for the November General Election.

Early Voting/Absentee Voting

The most popular voting options with voters have been early voting or going to the polls on Election Day. Early voting is placing your ballot directly in the ballot counter at City Hall one week prior to Election Day. Absentee voting is placing your ballot in a series of envelopes for processing one week prior to Election Day. If you would like a ballot mailed to you, apply online at mnvotes.org.

Primary Election absentee and early voting will take place for Farmington residents at Farmington City Hall, 430 Third St. If you live in Lakeville, you need to go to Lakeville City Hall. If you live in a township, you need to go to the county office in Apple Valley or Hastings.

Returning your absentee ballot

You need to return your ballot to the same location you received it from. DO NOT bring a Lakeville or township ballot to Farmington City Hall. Lakeville ballots need to go to Lakeville City Hall. Township ballots need to be returned to a county office in Apple Valley or Hastings.

Farmington residents can bring their ballot to the front desk at Farmington City Hall. It must be received by 3 p.m. on Election Day. Do not take an absentee ballot to a polling location – they cannot accept it.

Election Judge Sign-up Form

Required Qualifications:

- Eligible to vote in the State of Minnesota
- U.S. citizen and at least age 18
- Minnesota resident for at least 20 days prior to the election
- Able to read, write and speak English
- Appointed by the City of Farmington
- · Trained and certified as an election judge
- All applicants should be comfortable with using an iPad
- Able to hear in large crowds
- Have good finger dexterity for distributing ballots

An Election Judge cannot:

- Be a candidate on the ballot
- Be a spouse, parent, step-parent, child, step-child, sibling or step-sibling of a candidate or another election judge serving in the same precinct
- Live with a candidate on the ballot

Election Judge Duties:

- · Set up the polling place
- Operate voting equipment
- Register and assist voters
- Demonstrate how to vote
- Distribute ballots
- Close polling place
- Determine and certify voting results



CITY OF FARMINGTON POLLING LOCATIONS

If you want to vote on Election Day, you should go to your polling location from <u>7 a.m. to 8 p.m.</u> You will receive a postcard in the mail in early July designating your polling location. You can also go online to mnvotes.org to find your polling location. Where you vote depends on where your house is physically located. If you have a Farmington mailing address, but live in Lakeville, you vote in Lakeville. If you live in a township, you vote in the township. Farmington has six polling locations as shown on the map below.

Join your neighbors to keep food scraps out of the trash

The number one item in our trash is food and it's finding its way to the landfill. That's why nearly 8,000 Dakota County households have registered to participate in the free organics drop-off program. Across all eight locations, more than 10,000 pounds of food scraps and other compostable products are collected each week.

Bringing organics to a drop-off site is easy and can dramatically reduce waste. The typical household can divert up to one-third of trash by delivering items such as food scraps, spoiled produce, coffee grounds and bones. Instead of sitting

in a landfill, this material is turned into compost — a nutrient-rich soil additive — used in gardening and landscaping.

Sites are located throughout the county — Burnsville, Eagan, Farmington, Hastings, Lakeville, Mendota Heights, Rosemount and West St. Paul – with more sites opening this year.

Pumpkin Recycling


Recycle your pumpkins on Saturday, Nov. 5 and Sunday, Nov. 6. Drop off your pumpkins across from the cardboard recycling containers on Municipal Drive, just south of the Police Station, 19500 Municipal Drive. All the pumpkins will be composted and turned into soil to make new pumpkins for next year. Please be sure to remove all candles, wax and decorations. Painted pumpkins should go in the garbage.

Highway 3 Improvements

MnDOT in partnership with Dakota County, Empire Township and the City of Farmington is making improvements at the intersection of Highway 3 and County Road 66. The intersection closed to all traffic on July 5. Please check the detour map for the correct route to use. The intersection will re-open on Sept. 2. Work requiring shoulder closures will continue through Sept. 15. Schedules are weather pending and subject to change.


Prep for Winter

Although it's still summer, snow could fly in as little as three months! That means the plows will be out cleaning up after those pesky snow events and the streets and boulevards need to be free of obstacles to allow them to effectively complete their work. Fall is the time to start planning for the winter season and completing those winter prep projects.

Mailbox Repairs

If installed correctly and maintained in good condition, mailboxes should not be susceptible to winter damage. Remember, city policy allows mailbox replacement only if there has been direct contact with city snow removal equipment. The city is not responsible for damage to mailboxes that are knocked over by snow or ice rolling off the plow. Taking time now to inspect your mailbox for weaknesses and make any needed repairs is much more pleasant than addressing a damaged mailbox in the winter.


Mailboxes should be installed and maintained to meet the specifications of the U.S. Post Office and the city. These specifications allow for efficient mail delivery and ensure the mailbox is located outside the path of the plow. A clear zone should be provided 10 inches behind the curb and at least 41 inches high.



Winter Parking Reminder

Don't forget winter parking restrictions go into effect Tuesday, Nov. 1. No on street parking is allowed overnight until April.

Winter storage

During the summer months items migrate onto streets and in the boulevards, such as basketball hoops or other sporting equipment, that will cause problems in the winter months. All obstacles must be removed from the right of way and stored for the winter.

Public streets can be used to park personal vehicles overnight in the summer to make room for recreational vehicle parking on a driveway. However, when the winter parking restrictions go into effect, parking can get cramped. Keep these tips in mind as you store vehicles for the winter.

Recreational vehicle parking: Recreational vehicles parked on residential property shall be registered to the property owner or lessee and display a current license, may be parked or stored on the lot as follows:

- In the front yard, provided they are kept on a hard surfaced driveway. Recreational vehicles may not be parked in front of the principal building on a residential lot. Recreational vehicles may not be parked or stored on public property.
- In the side or rear yard, recreational vehicles shall be parked or stored on asphalt, concrete or decorative landscape rock.

<u>Vehicle parking</u>: All vehicles should be parked on a hard surface driveway or parking apron. All parking areas shall maintain a five-foot setback from side and rear lot lines.

71st Annual Turkey Bingo

Pink Patch Project

During the month of October, the Farmington Police Department will, again, participate in the Pink Patch Project. This initiative is a public awareness campaign designed to raise awareness and money for cancer. This is accomplished by creating a pink version of the police department's patch, coin or other memorabilia. The program originated in 2013 at a California police agency and focused on breast cancer. Today the concept has spread to hundreds of law enforcement agencies throughout the world and raises money for a variety of cancer related causes and charities.

In 2019, the Farmington Police Department joined several other Dakota County agencies in the project. Farmington partnered with the American Cancer Society to help raise money and awareness for cancer as well as provide support to cancer patients and survivors. In 2021, Farmington had their best year yet, raising more than \$2,200 for ACS and working together with other Minnesota agencies, raised more than \$30,000.

This October the project will be tying into the city's 150th anniversary theme. Make sure to watch the police department's Facebook page for the final product, along with information on how to make a purchase to support the program. Donations for the American Cancer Society will also be collected at this time for those who want to support the program but do not want any merchandise.



School Supply & Hygiene Product Drive






