#### **A Timeline of The Free Clinics**

Drs. Russell Sacco and Irwin Perlmutter gather community leaders into steering committee to create a free clinic in Henderson County.

First walk-in Medical Clinic is held on December 13th; volunteers for the clinic include: Steven Crane, MD; Pat Sells, RN; and Mary Collins.

First Diabetic Life Management Clinic is held on July 1st. First Dental Extraction Clinic is held on September 1st in collaboration with Blue Ridge Community Health Services; volunteers for the clinic include Pete Richards, DDS.

First Orthopedic Clinic is held on December 17th.

2004 First Eye Clinic is held on April 5th.

In September, Community Case Management Program (now known as Access Network) begins offering community access to specialty care for eligible patients of primary care physicians throughout Henderson County.

**2006** First Psychiatric Clinic is held on December 12th, in direct response to sudden closure of Mountain Laurel and disintegration of mental health system.

First Pulmonary Clinic is held on September 4th; as needs evolve, referrals are later available off-site through Access Network.

Relocation to new Russell J. Sacco Building in October. Adoption of Community Pharmacy from Partnership for Health in July and the Medi-Find Prescription Assistance Program from Interfaith Assistance Ministry in November.

**2009** TFC is accepted into AstraZeneca Bulk Shipment program, greatly expanding access to medications for patients in our community. TFC begins a new collaborative to initiate the Pardee Flat Rock Family Health Center.

First Endocrinology Clinic is held on February 5th. In partnership with Pardee Hospital, MAHEC, and Community Care of WNC, the Bridges to Health Project begins in June. First Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation Clinic is held on September 22nd.

TFC expands access to Specialty and Chronic Care Clinics to residents of Polk County in July. First Smoking Cessation Class is held on August 9th.

- TFC expands its prevention and wellness offerings, initiating community-wide flu shot clinics and wellness screening events. TFC begins providing psychotropic medications to inmates at the Henderson County Detention Center.
- With receipt of a federal HRSA grant, TFC greatly expands care for Polk County with a dedicated case manager and medication delivery locally in partnership with St. Luke's Hospital. TFC also deepens partnership with Wingate School of Pharmacy. TFC expands Bridges to Health program, tripling patients served and adding new partners, staff and services.
- In partnership with Hope Coalition, TFC begins offering live-saving medication Naloxone through our community pharmacy. TFC launches Patient Health Advocacy program to address barriers to health and nurture patient engagement in their own health.
- **2016** TFC launches Community Garden with patient volunteers to address food insecurity, promote healthy foods, and encourage patient engagement. TFC also initiates Bikes 4 Life bicycle donation/refurbishment program to address patients' transportation needs. Bridges to Health is named a national finalist for the Kate B. Reynolds Charitable Trust Innovations in Rural Health Award.
- TFC introduces HealthWays "viral health" program to engage community members in supporting healthy choices and lifestyles. The Bridges to Health group care model is brought to patients in the Henderson County Detention Center.
- In partnership with AdventHealth and Safelight, launch of the Phoenix Project: an integrated, trauma-informed care program for very vulnerable clients, including survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, human trafficking, and those with significant mental health and/or substance misuse concerns.
- Revamped Diabetes program to follow the Bridges to Health group model. Dr. Crane is invited to deliver several national presentations about TFC's person-centered model of care.
- **2020** Embedded two staff members at the Henderson County Detention Center; this initiative won an Excellence in Innovation award after just 9 months. Launch of PORT (Post-Overdose Response Team) in Henderson County. TFC also opens first dedicated office in Polk County.
- TFC begins providing COVID-19 vaccinations to the Henderson County Detention Center and local residents. Polk office provides COVID testing per county referrals. HopeShot medication-assisted treatment program for those with substance use disorder begins. TFC adds bilingual Outreach staff member to engage Latinx population.
- Launch of Polk Bridges to Health group, Spanish Bridges to Health, and Project Sotiria a job-training program for those with history of substance misuse and justice involvement.

It has now been 20 remarkable years since the opening dedication of The Free Clinic in Hendersonville. Speaking as one of three of Russell Sacco's sons, we remain honored and humbled by the legacy he left behind and the continued selfless medical and social assistance that the Clinics provide to all the people who remain in the economic shadows of society.



Altruism can be defined as the principle or practice of unselfish concern for or the devotion to the welfare of others. The foundational concept of The Free Clinics is clearly based upon this human value. Our father always had a keen sense of who needed extra care and assistance; of who was in danger of "falling through the cracks". As such, his idea of fostering a safe harbor for the underprivileged to obtain much needed medical care developed years prior. And to be able to witness his dream actually materialize into this vibrant gem in the community prior to his death was a defining moment in his life.

So, my brothers and I want to again thank and honor The Free Clinics and all the incredibly dedicated staff that has and continues to support all those in need, and in doing so, please know that you are all raising the level of consciousness locally, regionally, and globally.

#### MILESTONES IN CREATING THE FREE CLINICS


1998 -Dr. Sacco began advocating for a Free Clinic. April 1999 -Invited Healthcare Leaders to the first "Exploratory Committee to Establish a Free Medical Clinic for Henderson County". September 1999 – Began an inclusive process with the Henderson Co Partnership for Health. Their BOD approved adding a member of our Exploratory Committee to serve on their BOD. Dr. Sacco said, "No one organization alone can solve the problem of health care access. It takes a whole community working together." September 1999 – Invited Dr. Irwin Perlmutter & Dr. Colin Thomas to join in these efforts. **October 1999 –** The Exploratory Committee officially became the "Steering Committee for a Henderson County Free Medical Clinic" and appointed its first Board of Directors with Jim Howard as President. May 2000 -The Steering Committee formally established itself as the "Henderson County Free Medical Clinics". NC House Bill 1153 advocated by Dr. Sacco and submitted by May 2000 -N.C. Rep Larry Justus, the "Retired Physician License Act", gave physicians immunity from liability. The HCFMC voted to accept their first "Plan of Operation" and Sept 2000 -"Mission" statement. October 2000 -The first Website Domain was established: "freemedclinic.org". "Henderson County Free Medical Clinic, Inc" was incorporated December 2000 with the help of Ken Youngblood, Atty, and the first By-Laws were adopted. Dr. Sacco donated the funds to hire the first Executive Director. December 2000 -Jim Robbins, who was employed part time May 2001 -HCFMC became a 501-© (3) tax exempt organization with the assistance of Jim Barrett, Executive Director of Pisgah Legal Services. **August 2001 –** The BOD changed the name to "Volunteer Medical Resource Center", and Dr. Stephen Crane was appointed to the position of Volunteer Medical Director. October 2001 -Dr. Sacco funded the start-up expenses and provided his office rent free for the Free Clinics.




BOD, the VMRC opened its doors on December 13, 2001, and served SEVEN patients at 506 Park Hill Court.

## **2021 NC Hospital Utilization Statistics**








NC hospitals recognize a **78% reduction** in inappropriate hospital utilization, just by becoming a patient at TFC.


