

Choose to Live an Unshakeable Life this year

Dear friend of the ministry,

This year, our ministry has one central theme that we are building not only into our conference but also into many of our plans for 2026.

Precept Canada's theme is **Unshakeable**. What does this mean? What is the purpose? Why is this so important to us? What does it look like when a believer lives an unshakeable life? These are all questions we plan to answer throughout the year. Our prayer is that you will join us at one of our conferences, engage with us on social media, and talk to others about living the unshakeable life.

Let's take a few moments to give some insight into our theme.

What Does **Unshakeable** Mean?

In a Google search for the word *unshakeable*, I learned that it first began to be used in the late 1800s and has become part of regular speech since 2019. I couldn't help but notice that the word *unshakeable* has become more common over the past six years as we have seen cultural decline all around us. Amid an increase in mental health struggles, uncertainty in our economy, greater persecution of the church, and the polarization of the country, as waves of uncertainty crash around us, there is a greater use of the word *unshakeable*. *Unshakeable* can be defined as "not able to be shaken, disturbed, or weakened, either physically or emotionally, by what is happening around you."

We might better understand the word *unshakeable* by considering synonyms such as steadfast, unwavering, immovable, or rock-solid. One scholar defined

unshakeable as "a person who is firm, steady, and confident despite pressure, doubt, and adversity."

After reviewing the definition, I hope you can start to see why this is our focus for 2026.

What Is The Purpose?

In 2025, our conference focus was **Overcoming Spiritual Warfare**. If you did not have a chance to attend the conference, you can view it in our **Entrust Academy** and work through the conference material at your own pace. Our hope in hosting the **Overcoming Spiritual Warfare conference** was to ensure we are all alert to the fact that we are at war. A battle is being waged every day, and the Bible tells us to put on the armour of God and be prepared for it. This year, we want to build on the warfare conference by taking all we learned in 2025 as a foundation to examine how vital it is to change our mindset in all things. Paul says in Philippians 4, "*Rejoice in the Lord ALWAYS.*" How is this possible? We can only do this by living an unshakeable life. In 2026, we want to equip you to be able to rejoice always.

Why Is This Important To Us?

The unshakeable life is vital to the life of a believer because it is Biblical. God's Word calls us to live the unshakeable life, and the Bible offers many examples of people who did so—Abraham, Joseph, Daniel, Job, David, Esther, and Paul, to name a few. Each of them lived out the unshakeable life in different circumstances. Abraham, unshakeable in his faith; Joseph, in his



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integrity amid unjust circumstances; Daniel, when under extreme pressure; Job, in suffering; Esther, in her courage; Paul, staying on mission while being persecuted for the Gospel. There is one other great example of the unshakeable life, and that is Jesus. Jesus faced temptation, betrayal, injustice, and crucifixion, yet remained faithful to His Father. The Bible calls us not only to learn from these faithful people but also to imitate Jesus in all things. This includes living an unshakeable life.

We are living in tumultuous times, and now more than ever, we need to see that the unshakeable life is rooted in the character of God, marked by obedience to God's Word rather than living a comfortable life. The unshakeable person is strengthened by God's Word and through prayer, and finally, the unshakeable person is focused on God's calling and purposes for their lives.

Do you see why *Unshakeable* is our focus? Ministry partners, our prayer is that our conferences are overflowing with people who have a heart to live the unshakeable life. It is possible to rejoice in the Lord in all circumstances; it is possible to stand firm in adversity.
