Easter Greetings!

We made it through the long, hard, never-ending winter! Even for a native Minnesotan, it's been A LOT.

The church liturgical calendar coincides with our need to break forth into a season of new life and joy. Easter is not just a one-day event, but rather a 50-day celebration known as the season of Eastertide. Historically this season lasted 40 days to commemorate the time the resurrected Jesus remained on earth before his Ascension, however for most of us in western churches Eastertide lasts 50 days, ending on Pentecost. I can appreciate the thought to just extend the celebration by 10 days all the way until Pentecost, which itself is a celebratory season! Pentecost marks when the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples. At the first Pentecost over 3000 people were baptized, creating the first church. This is why Pentecost is known as the birthday of the church.

WHAT'S HAPPENING WITH WORSHIP ATTENDANCE?

For decades worship attendance was a metric churches used to measure engagement and growth. Most churches could anticipate the ebbs and flows throughout the calendar year and would track year over year comparisons. During the pandemic that stalwart methodology was flipped on its head! No one really knew how to track online attendance. Over the past couple of years we've been figuring out some key indicators that help us have a better sense of how many people are worshipping online.



In most churches, including Hamline, worship attendance in person and online fluctuated tremendously since March 2020. We wondered if we would ever see any stability again and how to interpret attendance in this new era. We now have over a year of experience with hybrid worship (online and in person) and are beginning to see some stabilizing. Walker Brault our worship technology coordinator helps measure attendance and has put together this helpful analysis:

For Hamline Church worship attendance appears to be bouncing back from the pandemic and possibly even growing beyond pre-pandemic levels. Easter 2023 in person attendance matched 2019. However, we also now have online attendance to consider as well. Facebook and YouTube both provide a live count of the number of devices playing a livestream. While there is no direct translation between online attendance and in person attendance, taking the conservative view that only 1 person was watching per device online, 2023 was the most attended Easter service on record (since 2009).

More broadly, our live attendance is on par with the 2018-2019 church year (last full pre-pandemic year) with an average Sunday attendance of 204 people between rally Sunday and the third Sunday in April (Easter is included both years). In line with other years, we would expect this to drop as we move into summer and vacations become more common.

Additionally, we are also seeing a shift relative to the 2021-2022 church year to a greater percentage of worship participants joining in person.

We continue to see about 1/4 of our YouTube viewers accessing our streams through the website. We also continue to see a diversity in the types of devices people are tuning in on. Computers and phones both account for more than 1/3 of total views with TV coming in third with Tablets following. However, those engaging on their phones tend to watch significantly less of a service, on average 1/3 of what those watching by TV view.

Of additional note, our most watched video on YouTube is Eileen's recording of Ode to Joy posted July 2020 which now has over 32,000 views. By comparison, our most watched online service was Easter 2020 with 404 views.

The final stage of our stained-glass window restoration is finally complete! Plaster and painting repairs around the windows frame these beautiful pieces of art nicely. They are ready to be enjoyed in a new light!



ENERGY EFFICIENCY

LEDs ahead! Thanks to the work put in by the Earthkeepers to have an Energy Audit performed for the church, and the follow up they pursued with staff on some of the changes we can make to lower our carbon footprint, we will be able to benefit from a bulb replacement rebate and program through Premier Lighting, CEE, and Xcel Energy. All our 4ft long fluorescent bulbs throughout the education wing will be getting replaced, saving us over \$8,000 in lighting and energy efficiency upgrades!

SECURITY UPDATES

As a follow up from our security assessment and the trainings we underwent with Rev. Chris Carr of Daikon consulting last year, the next step is to move forward with several measures:

- 1. Installing additional cameras and motion sensors throughout the church building.
- 2. Replacing the security light at the southwest corner of the building with a daylight sensor LED light.
- 3. Acquiring our own traffic barricades to have on hand, which will help keep the children safe while working in the sprout garden, and can be utilized for an added safety measure during events at Hamline.

YOU'RE INVITED TO BE A PART OF THE SECURITY COMMITTEE/TASK FORCE!

We would like to invite church members to be part of the formation of a Security Committee/Task Force. This committee will be dedicated to identifying safety needs and supporting the implementation of security measures, as they emerge. This will be an important team for the church, especially as our occupancy continues to increase and church life returns to more in person gatherings! LAND ACKNOWLEDGMENT STUDY

This winter 15 people from Hamline Church participated in a Land Acknowledgement Study. A Land Acknowledgement is a formal statement that recognizes and respects Indigenous Peoples as traditional stewards of this land and the enduring relationship that exists between Indigenous Peoples and their traditional territories. In the group's three sessions together, we talked about the history of this land, about our place in that history, and our calling and responsibilities as Christians and as members of Hamline Church. Several participants from the Land Acknowledgment Study formed a longer-term task force to continue learning about local indigenous communities and the indigenous history of Minnesota lands, as well as exploring reparative actions that the congregation can take in conjunction with a Land Acknowledgment statement. The Land Acknowledgment task force is open to anyone interested in learning about or engaging in this reparative work.

ENERGY AUDIT

Last fall, the Hamline Earthkeepers arranged with EnerChange to carry out an updated energy audit of Hamline Church's building and energy use. EnerChange provided the audit report in January, and the results of the audit were presented at the April Church Council meeting. Great news - since the church's last audit in 2014: 1) electricity use is down 4%; 2) Natural gas use is down 11%; and 3) In 2022, 28% of our electricity was generated by our solar panels! M U S I C UPDATE

ORGAN | THE MAGIC BUTTON

The buttons below the organ keyboards are called pistons and can be programmed to select whichever pipes the organist wants to use. But there is one very special piston labeled Full Organ which was pre-programmed by the organ builder to produce the biggest sound possible. On most organs, ours included, a red light comes on, a handy warning just in case it is pressed by mistake! It is designed to add the final crowning glory to a piece. If you were in church on Easter you heard it on the big chords at the end of the Widor Toccata. I don't use it every Sunday (a little goes a long way!) but it may pop in again in May or June. You don't need to be close enough to see the little red
