## The Huckleberry: A Continued Success

One year in, and it's obvious The Huckleberry, fondly referred to as "The Huck," has become the community center we envisioned, taking us from architects' sketches to real life memories. On August 25, 2023, we celebrated The Huckleberry's first birthday and the wrap of the café's first summer. Opening in August of 2022, we got our feet wet and introduced the newly renovated café to our community of residents, Montreat College students and staff, program participants, retreat quests, day hikers, and more. In January of 2023, during College Conference @ Montreat, we got our first taste of what operating with a large event onsite would feel like. This was our best sign of what was to come during the summer months. In May, we hired and trained new staff members who would help us pull off our first summer season, even adding a Montreat Summer Staffer to our workforce. Over the next nine weeks, we scooped almost 14,000 scoops of ice cream, brewed hundreds of gallons of Dynamite Roasting coffee, fried more pounds of french fries than one can count, and gave our espresso machine a workout pumping out lattes, mochas, cappuccinos, and more. Post summer, the chaos calmed but The Huck has continued to be a much appreciated and frequently used space. ## **Projects to Watch**

#### The Barn: Updated to Stay the Same

After generations of hosting Clubbies and mountain circle dances, the much-beloved Barn needs to be updated. President Richard DuBose is fond of saying that through these renovation efforts, we are "investing in it to keep it the same," which is what you do with things you love. Work began in the fall, and includes infrastructure improvements, new bathrooms, windows and doors, and enhanced light and sound capabilities. When you next enter The Barn, the hope is that the building will feel as it always has—just a bit more comfortable and sustainable for the next 50 years.





#### Revitalizing Lake Susan

Whether enjoying a quiet walk on its path, sitting a spell to take in the scenery, or doing some fishing or boating, most visitors to Montreat enjoy the lake at one point or another during their stay. Lake Susan is also the town's largest storm water retention facility. However, the lake's capacity has significantly declined in recent years due to upstream erosion. Now, thanks to a significant grant from the state, Lake Susan will be dredged for the first time in twenty years. This project, slated for the fall of 2024, marks the latest in a series of initiatives undertaken by the conference center to promote environmental sustainability and enhance the well-being of Montreat and the surrounding communities.

#### Memorial Garden Expansion

Work began in January 2024 on the Nancy Holland Sibley Memorial Garden expansion. This expansion will expand the scattering portion of the garden and the existing trail will also be made accessible to wheeled devices. A final completion date is difficult to pinpoint, but our goal is for the work to be completed by late spring of 2024.

#### Reviewing the Montreat Wilderness

The 2,500 acres that comprise the Montreat Wilderness are a popular destination for conferees, residents of the surrounding area, and visitors alike, and have seen an explosion of traffic over the past ten years. In 2023, Montreat Conference Center engaged a firm to assess the use and create a plan for the area to help us better manage this increase.



#### A New Strategic Plan on the Horizon

Montreat, the PC(USA), the greater Church, and the world have seen many significant changes in the decade since our last strategic plan. Montreat has fared those changes exceptionally well thanks to the grace of God, generous and committed supporters, a dedicated staff, and good planning. In 2023, our Board of Directors initiated a new strategic planning process to reaffirm our mission and discern the institution's strategic direction. This process is set to conclude in the fall of 2024 and will help guide us into the future.

#### An Update on Montreat's New Lodge

Montreat's need for expanded and updated housing has continued this year. The number of retreat groups and conferees desiring to come here regularly exceeds our capacity to accommodate these groups in conference center housing. After first receiving a permit from the Town of Montreat in 2022, an appellate court ruling has further delayed the project. In 2023, the conference center filed a notice to appeal this ruling to a higher court. In the meantime, we continue to move forward planning and fundraising for development of our property for the critical missional purpose of hospitality.


















### The Manna Retreat

After months of Zoom calls, hours of planning, dozens of team conversations, and long flights, we were finally there. On January 27th of 2023, the doors to Convocation Hall flew open, music pumped through the speakers, and The Manna Retreat began for the first time as 80 young adults in their 20s and early 30s streamed inside. It was a holy moment I will never forget.

The Manna Retreat is an initiative to create a conference space for young adults. For generations, Montreat has done an incredible job fostering the faith of youth and college students. I have witnessed and experienced that nurturing first hand. However, after college graduation, many of those young people never venture through those gates again. Based on my own experience as an associate pastor for young adult ministry, I knew that if we could create a space to nurture the faith of young people, they would come.

So for three days, The Manna Retreat leadership team spent our time and energy pouring into those young adults. Like manna in the wilderness, our prayer was to nurture and sustain the faith that those young people brought through small groups, keynote, worship, late night trivia, workshops, and group hikes.

At the end of the weekend, the entire conference group circled Convocation Hall. We stood shoulder to shoulder,

and looked around the room as we promised and reminded those young people that they were the rock that Christ was building the church on. There were tears and smiles, laughter and hope. It was a holy ground moment that I cannot wait to experience again. So, if you are a young adult and your faith could use some nourishing, I hope you'll join us. We have manna to share.




