



Dean

Meg Paul has dedicated over forty years to the performing arts, demonstrating a broad spectrum of skills and a commitment to excellence. With a background in classical and contemporary ballet, she has contributed to the fields of performance, choreography, and teaching. Her experience encompasses directing, program development, and community engagement, reflecting her passion for nurturing artistic talent.

Throughout her career, Meg has worked alongside historic dance pioneers and performed renowned works from distinguished choreographers, including Gerald Arpino, Robert Joffrey, Twyla Tharp, and Dwight Rhoden, as well as masterworks by Petipa, Ashton, Nijinsky, Massine, Balanchine, Forsythe, and Alonzo King. As a principal dancer with The Joffrey Ballet and Complexions Contemporary Ballet, Meg holds extensive national and international touring credits. Additionally, she served as Dance Captain and full swing for Twyla Tharpe's Tony-winning Broadway musical, Movin' Out, performing leading roles during its run.

Meg's contributions to the arts have been recognized with several awards, including The Princess Grace Award, the International Dance Competition of the Americas, the Detroit Renaissance Hero Award, the Sue Nine Endowment for Faculty Achievement Award, Wayne State University's College of Fine, Performing, and Communication Arts Teaching Award, and The Copperfoot Award.

As a co-founder of World Arts Inc., a NYC-based performing arts agency, Meg helped promote national and international companies, including Nacho Duato's Compania Nacional De Danza, Les Ballets De Monte Carlo, Complexions Contemporary Ballet, Les Grand Ballets Canadian, Dance Cuba, Les Ballets Africains, Washington Ballet, The Joffrey Ballet, and more.


As Director of Dance at the Music Hall Center for the Performing Arts, she curated and directed the National City Stars of Ballet and Broadway, which engaged local performers and pre-professionals to train and perform with ballet and Broadway professionals. For her work on National City Stars of Ballet and Broadway, Paul was honored as a recipient of the Detroit Renaissance Hero Award by the Detroit Free Press. During her tenure, she also curated, directed, and produced Music Hall's annual 313 Choreography Expo, highlighting Detroit's creative impact with other major cities.

From 2010 to 2022, Meg held various leadership roles at Wayne State University's Maggie Allesee Department of Theatre and Dance, including Associate Professor of Teaching, Recruitment Coordinator, and Director of Dance.

Meg was Associate Artistic Director and Rehearsal Director with Complexions Contemporary Ballet and Academy Director. Meg serves as a board member of the Gerald Arpino Foundation and is a master teacher and adjudicator for the Universal Ballet Competition and National Dance Honors.

In 2025, Meg was appointed Dean of the Joffrey Ballet School. She is honored to uphold Robert Joffrey and Gerald Arpino's legacy and the school's mission of innovation and inclusivity. She looks forward to collaborating with the Joffrey Ballet School team to foster the next generation of artists.

BRADLEY SHELVER Artistic Director & Choreographer

Bradley Shelver (South Africa) trained at the National School of the Arts in Johannesburg and at The Ailey School in New York. He is currently the Artistic Director of The Joffrey Concert Group, The Jazz and Contemporary Trainee Program at the Joffrey Ballet School and the Joffrey Pre Professional Contemporary Summer Program. He has danced with the Ailey II, Elisa Monte Dance, Complexions Contemporary Ballet, Ballet Hispanico, The Francesca Harper Project, Limón Dance Company, Phoenix Dance Theater (UK) and in projects with Bill T. Jones/Arnie Zane Dance Co., Lar Lubovich Dance, The Universal Ballet, Radio City Music Hall, and in productions with the Mark Morris Dance Group. He is in his 15th season as a principal dancer with The Metropolitan Opera Ballet. Mr. Shelver has choreographed works for; Joffrey Ballet Concert Group, Big Muddy Dance Company, Contemporary West Dance Theater, Graham 2, St Louis Dance Theater, Richmond Ballet, Ailey II, Ballet Austin, Bryant Park Summer Stage, Lustig Dance Theater, Compania Rio Danca, New Jersey Dance Theater Ensemble, Cape Dance Company, Cedar Lake 2, Sobers & Godley Dance, Nexus Dance Lab, as well as creating works for The Royal Danish and Royal Swedish Ballet Schools, Joffrey Ballet School, Central Ballet School (London) The Ailey School, Boston Conservatory, Long Island University and Purchase College. He is on the adjudication panel for numerous international competitions including; Valentina Koslova Ballet Competition, Festival Internacional de Dança (Brazil), Artistic Dance Exchange (USA), Miami International Ballet Competition (Columbia), Global Dance Open as well as competitions throughout Italy.

He was co-producer and curator for the annual REVERBdance Festival from 2010–2016. From 2013–2016, he was the Artistic Director of the STEPS Repertory Ensemble and the Production Director for Steps on Broadway. He has been company teacher for Mathew Bourne's "Adventures in Motion Pictures", The Lion King on Broadway, The Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater and Elisa Monte Dance. Mr Shelver is on the faculty of schools and universities worldwide including ABT/JKO School, Adjunct Professor at Montclair State University, The Limòn Institute, Complexions Contemporary Ballet Academy, Royal Danish and Royal Swedish Ballet Schools, The Ailey School, La Guardia High School for the Performing Arts, Joffrey Ballet School, Bikuratim (Israel), Pan American Modern Dance School (Brazil), Hinton Battle Academy. (Tokyo), DAR Jazz Academy (Russia) among others. He is a certified ballet teacher with the ABT National Training Curriculum. He was a contributing writer for Dance Spirit Magazine and His book, "Performance Through the Dance Technique of Lester Horton" is available worldwide.


ANGELICA STISKIN Artistic Director At-Large

Angelica Stiskin is an internationally acclaimed choreographer, director, performer, and dance educator, known for her influence across concert dance, commercial performance, and arts education. She currently serves as Artistic Director At-Large at Joffrey Ballet School, where she formerly led the Jazz & Contemporary Trainee Program and the flagship summer intensive, SPECTRUM. Since joining Joffrey in 2008, she has been a driving force in program development, was named Artistic Director in 2017, and has been a core member of the international Audition Tour since 2021. She also travels nationally with Heat Convention & Competition as part of Joffrey's educational and recruitment initiatives.

Raised in New Jersey, Angelica trained under renowned mentors including Dawn Laviola–Schaub, Yuliya Akopyan, and Billy Larson, beginning her professional touring experience at just 14. Her early work led to performances with ASH Contemporary Dance, Adrienne Canterna's American Dance Artists, and appearances with artists such as Rasta Thomas and Travis Wall. She earned her BFA in Dance from Marymount Manhattan College, performing works by Robert Battle, Shen Wei, and Lar Lubovitch. She later returned to MMC as a choreographer and adjunct faculty member, where she also developed and launched a new elective course for the dance program.

Her choreography and direction span live stage, film, and fashion, with collaborations that include Emmy Award-winner Mia Michaels, Justin Bieber, and the Disney Channel. Angelica has choreographed for New York Fashion Week in partnership with brands such as Louis Vuitton, Christian Dior Couture, and PatBO, and was commissioned by Bloomberg Philanthropies for the grand opening of the Perelman Performing Arts Center at the World Trade Center site. She also staged Robert Battle's "The Hunt" for Introdans in the Netherlands and worked closely with Battle's muse Marlena Wolfe in her company, The Wolfe Project. Additional creative projects include choreography for award-winning short films, artistic direction for editorial campaigns, and brand consulting, notably as Brand Design Director for the luxury movementwear line, Move Society.

Currently pursuing her Master's in Education Leadership at Harvard University, Angelica is committed to reimagining the role of dance within education systems and cultural spaces. She continues to teach, mentor, choreograph, and consult globally—driven by her mission to expand opportunity, representation, and innovation in the performing arts.



ANDREA MILLER

Choreographer

Andrea Miller is a groundbreaking choreographer, creative director, and founder of the internationally renowned multidisciplinary organization GALLIM, represented by Opus 3 Artists. A Hispanic creator and collaborator for dance, film, fashion, and the visual arts, Miller is known for her exploration of the essential elements of human behavior and the alchemy of movement and performance. Miller's dance works are presented by leading institutions and festivals around the world including Lincoln Center, Kennedy Center, New York City Center, The Joyce Theater, BAM, Jacob's Pillow, Royal Albert Hall, Sadler's Wells, London Royal Opera House, Théâtre National de Chaillot, Teatre Grec of Barcelona, Theaterhaus Stuttgart, Canal Madrid, Teatro Nacional de Panamá, DanceHouse Vancouver, Spoleto Festival, and others.

Miller is a Guggenheim, Sadler's Wells, New York City Center, and Princess Grace Fellow, and was featured in Forbes as an entrepreneur and leader in the dance world. She is the first choreographer to be named Artist in Residence at The Metropolitan Museum of Art, creating two large scale works for The Temple of Dendur and The Met Breuer. Her visual art collaborations include a sound, sculpture, and performance installation processing the pandemic for Lincoln Center as well as works for London V&A, The Glass House, Art Basel, Frieze Festival, Grace Farms, and Grand Central Station.

Recent dance commissions include English National Ballet, New York City Ballet, Martha Graham Dance Company, Bern Ballet, Noord Nederland Dans, Pennsylvania Ballet, A.I.M by Kyle Abraham, Rambert2, Ailey II, and The Juilliard School. Film collaborations include celebrated directors Ariel Schulman and Henry Joost, Xavier Dolan, Ezra Hurwitz, Bat–Sheva Guez, and long time collaborator Ben Stamper.

Her collaborations in fashion and brands include multiple projects with Hermès as well as Chanel, VOGUE, Bergdorf Goodman, SportsMax, KSwiss, Lacoste, Target, Calvin Klein, Crate & Barrel, SLS Hotels Miami and Las Vegas, and Beautiful Destinations.

Miller's repertory, creative methodology, and dance training have been taught at The Juilliard School, NYU, UC Kaufman, Harvard, Barnard, SUNY Purchase, and others. She has been Adjunct Professor at Marymount Manhattan College and Barnard, and is currently guest faculty at The Juilliard School, where she is an alumna.

In 2022 Miller's commitment to creativity and dance education led to the establishment of the GALLIM School of Movement, a home for the exchange of movement wisdom, artistic practice, and community building through dance. Miller created the GALLIM Moving Artist & Parent Moving Artist Residencies to provide holistic support to the large community of artists who have previously been underrepresented in the movement arts.

Miller serves on the board of Chelsea Factory and The Doris Humphrey Foundation.



BRIANA REED Choreographer

Briana Reed, two time recipient of the Key to the City of St. Petersburg, FL. her hometown, trained at Academy of Ballet Arts and The Pinellas County Center for the Arts. She received a full scholarship to attend The Juilliard School and after graduation she was invited to join Ailey II, one year later Ms. Reed joined The Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater where she performed as a Principal Dancer for sixteen seasons. Ms. Reed has performed on Good Morning America, ELLEN, Netflix's The Get Down Directed by Baz Luhrmann, MTV VMAS with Beyoncé, SNL, at The White House in honor of Judith Jamison and Mercedes Benz Fashion Week for designer Tracy Reese. Ms. Reed's choreography credits include: Camerata NYC Dance Festival, Tonya Pinkins Womyn Working It Out, Bat Boy The Musical at Aaron Davis Hall CCNY, Peace Be Still; Artist in Residence Western Washington University, Self-Love Simulation Theory; Steps Conservatory Summer Study, Wallflower Requiem; Steps Academy Pre-Professional Summer The Madison Theatre, Divinity In Paradox for vildwerk., VINGT-DEUX for Ballet Support Foundation, and Little Shop of Horrors at Virginia Stage Company. Chris Jarosz is a versatile and accomplished dancer with an extensive career spanning television, film, Broadway, and live performance. With a BFA in Dance Performance from Southern Methodist University, Chris has honed his skills in ballet, jazz, and modern dance, specializing in techniques like Taylor and Graham

On stage, Chris has dazzled audiences in iconic productions such as Wicked on Broadway and its national tour, as well as The Devil Wears Prada as Swing and Dance Captain. His dynamic presence has also been featured in the Radio City New York Spectacular and Cirque du Soleil's Viva Elvis, and IRIS.

In television and film, Chris has danced in acclaimed projects such as Glee, The Marvelous Mrs. Maisel, In the Heights, La La Land, Behind The Candelabra, Marry Me, Halston, SNL and Jimmy Fallon to name a few. Chris was also featured as a Top 20 contestant on So You Think You Can Dance season 4, showcasing his talent on a national stage.

THANG DAO Choreographer

Thang Dao resides between Los Angeles and New York City where he works as a freelance choreographer, educator, and coach. He is a graduate of Hollins University (MFA' 21) and New York University (MA' 09). Dao received his formal dance education from the Juilliard School and Boston Conservatory (BFA' 01).

Dao performed nationally and internationally with the Stephen Petronio Company between 2001–2006. He also danced for the Metropolitan Opera between 2006–2008. He has choreographed for Hubbard Street Dance Chicago, Ballet Austin, Ballet Austin II, Ailey II, Ballet X, Philadanco, Taiwan National University of the Arts, Jacob's Pillow, Missouri Contemporary Ballet, Kennesaw State University, Troy University, Michigan State University, and the Boston Conservatory along with many universities and performing arts schools nationally and internationally.

His works have toured throughout the United States, Europe, and Asia with acclaimed reviews. His ballet Stepping Ground, choreographed for Ballet Austin for the 1st Biannual New American Dance Talent, received the Audience Choice Award all four nights. Dao is the recipient of the 2008 Princess Grace Choreography Fellowship, the 2009 Special Project Grant, and the 2012 Vilcek finalist for Creative Promise in choreography. In 2012, his work Waiting Women was featured at NYCDAF Gala: Destiny Rising at the Joyce Theater in New York. Dao was part of the creative team for the James Brown Project: Get On The Good Foot commissioned and produced by the Apollo Theater in collaboration with Philadanco under the artistic direction of Otis Salid.
