





Bending Line 2. Narrow Jump (5'6"-8') 3. Roll back turn 4. Fence at the end of the ring 5. Long approach to a single jump E. Liverpools, water jumps or water used as decoration are prohibited. F. Testing: Two or more tests of the following number of competitors are required. In classes with three (3) who complete the course, three (3) competitors must be called back for testing. In classes with four (4) to thirty (30) who complete the course, at least the top four (4) competitors must be called back for testing. In classes with thirtyone (31) or more who complete the course, at least the top six (6) competitors must be called back for testing. Eight places must be awarded in classes with thirty-one (31) or more entries. Tests 1-17. Any exhibitor who does not participate in the testing is placed last of those exhibitors called back to test. Should more than one exhibitor fail to return for testing they will be placed at the judge's discretion. Only one rider per horse (EQ-2.111 5.B)

General Rules & Regulations:

1. USEF

Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current Federation Rule Book and FEI Rules, will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE AND JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS AT THE MODIFIED LEVEL OR ABOVE, COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS AT THE ADVANCED LEVEL, DRESSAGE COMPETITIONS, ENDURANCE RIDES AND VAULTING COMPETITIONS: (SEE GR828.4 OF THE FEDERATION RULES). LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE AND JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS AT THE MODIFIED LEVEL OR ABOVE AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS AT THE ADVANCED LEVEL, DRESSAGE, REINING AND VAULTING COMPETITIONS AND ENDURANCE RIDES. A NON-MEMBER MAY PARTICIPATE AS A HANDLER, RIDER, DRIVER, OWNER, LESSEE, OR AGENT, AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS, DRESSAGE COMPETITIONS, REINING COMPETITIONS AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS UPON PAYMENT OF A SHOW PASS FEE. PARTICIPANTS IN THE FOLLOWING CLASSES ARE EXEMPTED FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS RULE: 1) LEADLINE; 2) EXHIBITIONS; 3) GAMES AND RACES; 4) CLASSES FOR 4-H MEMBERS; 5) WALK TROT (EXCEPTION: FRIESIAN PERFORMANCE FR231) AND ACADEMY CLASSES (ACADEMY CLASSES ARE CLASSES LIMITED TO HORSES USED REGULARLY IN A LESSON PROGRAM); 6) USDF INTRODUCTORY LEVEL TESTS, PAS DE DEUX AND QUADRILLE CLASSES; 7) NRHA ENDORSED REINING COMPETITIONS. 8) OPPORTUNITY CLASSES, 9) CITIZENS OF OTHER NATIONS WHO HAVE PROOF, IN ENGLISH, OF CURRENT MEMBERSHIP IN GOOD STANDING OF THEIR OWN NATIONAL FEDERATION, 10) USEA BEGINNER NOVICE DIVISION; AND 11) ASSISTANT HANDLERS IN DRESSAGE SPORT HORSE BREEDING CLASSES

Federation Entry Agreement - By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors, and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right to publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

Horse Recordings GR1102 - The Federation maintains the only official record of winnings of horses at all Regular Competitions. To keep these records consistent, a horse should be recorded with the Federation in the same name of horse and owner under which it is exhibited at competitions. The Federation's horse recording records are not a title registry and the Federation does not decide, otherwise resolve, or become involved in ownership disputes.

Microchip HU104: As of December 1, 2017, all horses competing in classes that require USHJA horse registration must provide a microchip number that verifies their animal's identity in order to compete for points, money won or be eligible for Federation and/or USHJA programs and awards where horses are required to be recorded or registered. A microchip used to verify identity must be a fifteen digit ISO compliant 11784/11785 chip and be implanted in the nuchal ligament of the animal. This rule will have a transition period from December 1, 2017 to November 30, 2018. During this period, animals that are not in compliance with this rule will not receive points or be eligible for Federation and/or USHJA programs and awards. After this period, all horses that are competing in classes which require USHJA registration which are not microchipped will be ineligible to compete in Federation licensed competitions. Exceptions: USHJA Outreach and those activities enumerated in GR901.9, items 1-9.

2. CLOSING DATES:

- a) Entries will be due Monday, August 20, 2025. Any entries received after this date will have an increase stall fee of \$350.
- b) SEMF requires that stall fee and service fee be paid with all incoming entries through RingRadar.

3. ACCEPTANCE OF ENTRIES:

Once a horse is entered and accepted by the show it may not be withdrawn from competition without the permission of management. Exhibitors shall be held responsible for the stabling fee and service fee of all horse entered by them or their authorized agents(s) even though payment of these fees is not submitted with the entry form. In any case, horses that have not shown in classes on which they have been entered shall forfeit their fees except if a horse becomes ill or is injured prior to the start of the class or classes entered. The entry fee in this case will be dropped, upon receipt of a certificate signed by a licensed veterinarian and presented to the show secretary prior to the start of the class or classes entered. Once the show has started, only certificates signed by the Show Veterinarian will be accepted. The Horse Show Management reserves to itself the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without claim for damages; to change any course, to cancel or combine any classes, or to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges; use dotted line; and to change the specifications in jumper classes as competition warrants.

4. REQUIRED SIGNATURES ON ENTRY FORMS:

Entry forms will be accepted only when signed by every exhibitor, rider, coach, agent, and trainer. If the rider or owner is a minor, the signature of the parent, guardian or trainer must be provided. Upon failure to sign an entry blank as required, such person (s) shall be subject to an automatic fine of \$250. (GR 908) Entry forms must be accompanied by a check or credit card for stall fee. No acknowledgement will be mailed.

5. STABLING:

The cost per boarding stall or tack boarding stall is \$300.00. 471 Permanent boarding stalls with doors will be provided. Boarding Stalls are cement 12' by 12' with clay based flooring. - no initial shavings will be provided- Management reserves the right to limit tack boarding stalls. STALL PAYMENTS MUST ACCOMPANY STALL RESERVATIONS. Initial bedding will not be provided, and will be available through the fairgrounds.

6. PRIZE MONEY:

Prize money will be credited back towards each exhibitor's account. All refunds will be paid within 30 days off the close off the competition. IRS 1099 Miscellaneous Income Forms will be issued to the 1099 designee listed on the entry form. Prize money will be paid within 30 days of the last day of the show.

7. SHOW OFFICE HOURS:

The Show Office will be open beginning one hour before the start of each show day and will close one half hour after the last class. Exhibitor accounts will be processed and numbers given out in the show office on TUESDAY from 1:00 PM until 6:00 PM.

General Rules & Regulations:

8. BACK NUMBERS:

Numbers will be issued only when entries have been paid or an open check or credit card has been left, and when all necessary signatures, waivers, addresses, Social Security Information for Prize Money, USEF measurement, amateur, and membership cards have been presented for all riders; trainers and owners on entry. **All horses on grounds must wear their back number whether being handwalked or ridden at all times.**

9. PRESENTATION OF FEDERATION MEMBERSHIP CARDS:

All owners, senior, junior, amateur, adult amateur riders and trainers are required to present the actual or a copy of their Federation membership card to the Show Secretary. Failure to present a card will result in a \$45 per USEF and \$30 per USHJA fee (\$75.00 total) charged by USEF show pass fees. Junior and pony hunters must present the actual or a copy of their measurement cards at the Show Office before numbers may be picked up. All ponies and junior hunters that do not possess a current measurement card will be measured. All non-members will be charged a show pass fee by USEF. Time and place of measurement stations will be announced.

10. Management reserves the right to limit the Courtesy Circle in Hunter and Equitation classes.

11. Horses competing without a number or with an incorrect number may be refused an award at Management's discretion.

12. Horses will be allowed in the show rings only at such hours as are announced by Management.

13. The Open Numerical Hunter Scoring System will be used at the discretion of Management.

14. Orders of Go are produced in accordance with USEF Rules. Riders and trainers who have conflicts due to classes in more than one ring at the same time should see the Paddock Master so that necessary adjustments can be made. At no time will any ring be held up over 3 minutes due to conflicts.

15. All dogs must be leashed at all times while on the show grounds. Loose dogs will be picked up and detained until the owner has paid a \$100 fine. For a second offense, the owner may be barred from showing and required to leave the show grounds. We find this extreme action necessary in order to protect our exhibitors and their horses from injury.

16. Parking will be permitted in designated parking areas only. Vehicles may be brought to the stabling areas for only the purpose of loading and unloading and then must be promptly moved to the Van Parking Area. Your cooperation is appreciated.

17. All entries are required to have a stall per Florida State Fairgrounds and Fair Authority regulations.

18. In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, Bio Hazardous Medical Waste Containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of the waste.

19. An office fee of 10% or \$25 (which ever is greater) will be charged on all returned checks.

20. All horses entering the state of Florida must possess an official interstate health certificate issued by a licensed veterinarian attesting to the fact that the animals are free from any symptom of infections or communicable disease. Current negative Coggins Test must be available upon demand.

21. All ADDS and SCRATCHES must be completed online or through the Show Office AND taken to the ring before the class begins

22. All exhibitors are required to wear properly fitting protective headgear when jumping on the show grounds. Additionally, all riders (including adults) in hunter, hunt seat equitation and jumper classes is required and while jumping on competition grounds must wear ASTM/SEI approved helmets. See GR 801.2 for further details. USEF rule 157 & JP103 the use of any device with earbuds while mouted is prohibited in all schooling rings and areas.

23. Southeast Medal Finals, LLC., The Bob Thomas Equestrian Center, their officials and employees will not be responsible for any accident or loss which may occur to any exhibitor, spectators, guest, rider, groom, attendant or other employee, animal or equipment at any of the shows.

24. Should any question arise that is not provided for in the rules, the same shall be referred to the show committee whose decision shall be final.

25. Trophies: In classes not offering prize money, prizes will be awarded.

26. By signing the entry form, exhibitors acknowledge and understand the following warning as provided in Florida Senate Bill 1658, Chapter 773, "Equine Zero Liability Statute": WARNING – Under Florida law, an Equine Activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risk of equine activities."

27. Tack stall splits will be accepted when all entries are received and before Noon on Saturday.

28. MOTORIZED VEHICLE USEF RULE:

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. is rule. filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance.

29. SCHOOLING RULES:

- Tuesday from 12PM-5PM in all rings except the Grand Prix ring - the entire week the Grand Prix ring is hacking ONLY
- Wednesday open schooling in Mische, Serio and Covered Rings until 5PM and after the show is finished until 5PM in the indoor ring
- Thursday open schooling in Serio and Covered Rings until 5PM and after show is finished until 5 PM in the Indoor and Mische rings
- Friday - Sunday schooling will only be available if time permits after the show is finished and if it is before 5PM
- A flat rate of \$40 is charged for the entire show for schooling.

30. CHECK OUT - ANY MISTAKES AT CHECKOUT MUST BE RESOLVED WITHIN 24 HOURS. EXPRESS CHECK OUT - You may check out online through your Ring Radar account

31. OFFICIAL PHOTOGRAPHERS: Official show photographer is Victoria Demore Photography. Anyone caught taking photos and selling to exhibitors could be fined by the horse show up to \$250.

32. Food concessions will be available during horse show hours.

33. HU101

All horses competing in Federation non-breed restricted licensed competitions with hunter, hunter breeding, jumper and hunter seat equitation classes npt restricted by breed must be properly identified in accordance with GR 1101, and must also be registered with USHJA (CGR1101.1). The USEF/USHJA registration number for each horse must be entered on all entry forms for licensed competitions. Only one Registration Number will be issued per horse, and must remain with the horse throughout its career. Applications for USHJA registration can be completed online at www.ushja.org or www.usef.org using the USEF Horse Registration application form. This form is also available from the USHJA or federation office as a download from the USHJA or federation website or from competition management. Competition management is responsible for notifying exhibitors of this requirement in their prize list.

General Rules & Regulations:

In addition to the provisions of HU 101.1, on or after December 1, 2017, all horses competing in classes that require USHJA horse registration must provide a microchip number that verifies their animals identity in order to compete for points, money won, or be eligible for federation and/or USHJA programs and awards where horses are required to be recorded or registered. A microchip used to verify identity must be a 15 digit ISO compliant 11784/11785 chip and be implanted in the nuchal ligament of the animal.

34. EQUINE VACCINATION RULE

At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested. Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee.

35. ANIMAL WELFARE POLICY

Upholding the welfare of the horses exhibited here is of primary concern to Southeast Medal Finals and its officials. We require that all horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion and never be subject to mistreatment. Owners, trainers, riders and grooms, or their agents, must use reasonable care in the handling and treatment of their horses, whether owned or placed in their care for competition or for any other purpose. At all times for horses competing at SEMF we will provide for the continuous well-being of the horse by vigorously enforcing the rules of the USEF, which pertain to the welfare of the horse. Exhibitors are cautioned that GR838 (which defines the USEF's policy on abuse), GR843 (which pertains to Poling), and GR839 (which pertains to the Use of Whips), will be strictly enforced. Any handling and veterinary treatment should ensure the health and welfare of the horse. High standards of nutrition, health, sanitation and safety shall be encouraged and maintained at all times. Adequate provision will be made for ventilation, feeding and watering and maintaining a healthy environment. Any method of riding and training should take account of the horse as a living entity, and must not include any technique considered to be abusive. The well being of the horse must be considered above the demands of the breeders, trainers, riders, owners, dealers, organizers, sponsors or officials. Violators are subject, under the above rules, to elimination from competition and to protest or charge with resulting formal proceedings which may result in severe fines, suspensions or other penalties. To affirm the sport of show jumping to the general public in a positive, humane light, and eliminate those training method which may be misconstrued, we are maintaining the following policy for all horses competing at SEMF, starting one half hour before the first scheduled class of competition and continuing until the last scheduled class of the competition is completed:

36. POLING AND OFF-SETS: (GR843)

Manual poling and/or the use of bamboo off-sets are prohibited for all horses competing at Southeast Medal Finals. Any rider, trainer, groom or any other person who is in violation of the rules set forth above will be fined \$500 for each incident and may be suspended from further competition for the duration of the scheduled competition starting from the time of the incident. Any horse upon which a violation of the manual poling and/or use of bamboo offsets rule is perpetrated will be suspended from competition for the duration of the scheduled competition. All entry fees for the classes entered during the suspended period of the horse in question will be forfeited.

37. USE OF WHIPS & SPURS: (GR839)

The use of a whip by any rider at any one incident will be restricted to three lashes behind the girth. Any rider, who in the opinion of the judges, stewards or schooling supervisors, uses his whip or spurs in a cruel or excessive manner will be immediately eliminated from the class in which the incident occurred, and be suspended from further competition for a twenty-four hour period starting from the time of the incident. In the case of further violations by that exhibitor, on the same horse or another horse, the exhibitor may be barred from any or all future classes at the competition in which the violations occurred and all stabling fees, nominations fees and entry fees will be forfeited.

All incidents will be reported in the Steward's and/or Technical Delegate's Report and reviewed by USEF's Executive Director for possible further investigation and charges for hearing before USEF's National Hearing Committee.

38. HOSPITAL



JUDGING FOR ALL HUNTER SECTIONS:

- To be judged on performance and soundness, suitability to count.
- Horses and Ponies are not required to jog for soundness.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADULT AMATEURS: HUNTER, JUMPER, AND EQUITATION:

- To be ridden by exhibitors who have reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year and who hold a current USEF Amateur certification. Open to horses and ponies.

ELIGIBILITY FOR CHILDREN'S SECTIONS: HUNTER, JUMPER, AND EQUITATION:

- To be ridden by exhibitors who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year.

ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER

Sections offered and requirements: • Adult Amateurs – may be split into three (3) sections

Cross Entry:

Rider: Riders in this section may enter any Equitation class and any class where otherwise eligible. Riders who compete in the Amateur Owner Hunter and/or Jumper classes may show other horses that they own in the Adult Amateur Hunters. Riders competing in the Amateur Owner 3'3" section (but not competing in the Amateur Owner 3'6" section) may ride one horse that they do not own in the Adult Amateur Hunter section.

Horse: Horses and ponies exhibiting in this section may cross enter multiple sections of Adult Amateur Hunter and any classes where eligible.

Fence height: • 3'0" with spreads not to exceed the fence height.

- Courses will not be adjusted for ponies.
- In and outs will be permitted.

Combining/Dividing Sections: May be split into three sections:

- Adult Amateurs 18– 35
- Adult Amateurs 36– 54
- Adult Amateurs 55 & over

The Adult Amateur Hunter section may be divided by age of rider and/or height of fences. If there are fewer than three (3) entries in a section, that section must be combined with another Adult Amateur section. The Adult Amateur Hunter section may be combined with the Children's Hunter section when there are fewer than three (3) entries in either section. When sections are combined and there are more than 24 total entries, the sections must be divided utilizing a Floating split, or a California split to create an even division of entries.

Awards: Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following sections:

- Adult Amateur Hunter 18- 35
- Adult Amateur Hunter 36-54
- Adult Amateur Hunter 55 & over

LOW ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER

Eligibility: Open to exhibitors who have reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year.

Cross Entry:

Rider: Riders may not cross enter into any class or section at the same competition where fences exceed 3'3" (Exception: All Equitation classes and Jumper Classes 1.15m and below).

Riders who compete in the 3' Adult Hunters and/or the 3'3" Amateur Owner Hunter classes may show horses that they own in the Low Adult Hunters and one that they do not own in the Low Adult Hunters. **Horse and Rider Combination:** Low Adult Amateur Hunter horse/rider combinations may not cross enter into any classes or section where fences exceed 2'9".

Fence height: • 2'6"

Combining/Dividing Sections: The Low Adult Amateur Hunter section may be combined with the Low Children's Hunter section when there are fewer than four (4) entries in either section. If sections are combined and there are more than 24 total entries, the sections must be divided utilizing a Floating split, or a California split to create an even division of entries.

Awards: Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following section:

- Low Adult Amateur Hunter

AMATEUR JUMPER Sections offered and requirements:

- 1.0M/1.05M Amateur Jumper
- 1.10M/1.15M Amateur Jumper

Cross Entry: Competition Management may restrict cross entries between 1.10/1.15m and 1.00/1.05m sections at the same competition if stated in the prize list. **Rider:** Any competitor that competes in any class set at over 1.25m is ineligible to compete in an Amateur Jumper class set below 1.20m at that competition. **Horse and Rider Combination:**

1.00/1.05m Amateur Jumper horse/rider combinations may not cross enter into any classes held above 1.15m at the same show. 1.00/1.05m Amateur Jumper horse/rider combinations may enter only one classic, if both 1.00/1.05m and 1.10/1.15m are offered. 1.10/1.15m Amateur Jumper horse/rider combinations are not permitted to cross enter into Amateur Owner Jumper classes or any class at 1.20m and above, that offers prize money, at the same competition. 1.10/1.15m Amateur Jumper horse/rider combinations may enter only one classic, if both 1.00/1.05m and 1.10/1.15m are offered.

Fence Height: Amateur Jumper 1.00m to 1.05m • Amateur Jumper 1.10m to 1.15m

Combining/Dividing Sections: Junior sections may be divided by or combined with Amateur Jumper sections, at management's discretion, if so stated in the prize list.

Awards: Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following sections: • Low Adult Amateur Jumper • High Adult Amateur Jumper

- Spreads not to exceed fence height

CHILDREN'S HUNTER HORSE

Sections offered and requirements: • Children's Hunter Horse 14 & Under • Children's Hunter Horse 15- 17

Cross Entry: Rider: Riders in this section may enter any Equitation class and may compete with one different horse in the Junior 3'3" Hunter section but may not cross-enter into any Junior 3'6" Hunter or any Jumper class above 1.20m that offers prize money at the same show. **Horses/Ponies:** Horses and ponies exhibited in this section may cross enter multiple sections of Children's Hunter and any classes where eligible.

Fence Height: • 3'0" with spreads not to exceed fence height. • In and outs will be permitted
Combining/Dividing Sections: The Children's Hunter Horse section may be divided by age of rider. When the Children's Hunter Horse section is divided by age it will be divided: Children's Hunter Horse 14 & Under and Children's Hunter Horse 15- 17. If there are fewer than three (3) entries in either age section, the two sections must be combined. The Children's Hunter Horse section may be combined with the Children's Hunter Pony when there are fewer than three (3) entries in either section. Alternatively, the Children's Hunter Horse section may be combined with the Adult Amateur section when there are fewer than three (3) entries in either section. The Children's Hunter (horse & pony) section may be combined with the Adult Amateur section when there are fewer than three (3) entries in either section. When sections are combined and there are more than 24 total entries, the sections must be divided utilizing a Floating split, or a California split to create an even division of entries.

Awards: Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following sections:
• Children's Hunter Horse 14 & Under • Children's Hunter Horse 15- 17

LOW CHILDREN'S HUNTER HORSE

Eligibility: Open to exhibitors who have not yet reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year.

Cross Entry: Rider: Riders may not cross enter into any class or section at the same competition where fences exceed 3'3" (Exception: All Equitation classes and Jumper Classes at 1.15m and below). Riders who compete in the 3' Children's Hunter Horse, Regular A Rated Pony Sections, and/or Junior Hunter 3'3" classes may show one horse in the Low Children's Hunter. **Horse and Rider Combination:** Low Children's Hunter horse/rider combinations may not cross enter into any classes or section where fences exceed 2'9".

Fence height: 2'6"

Combining/Dividing Sections: The Low Children's Hunter section may be combined with the Low Adult Amateur Hunter section when there are fewer than four (4) entries in either section. When sections are combined and there are more than 24 total entries, the sections must be divided utilizing a Floating split, or a California split to create an even division of entries..

Awards: Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following section: • Low Children's Hunter Horse

CHILDREN'S HUNTER PONY

Sections offered and requirements: • Small/Medium Children's Pony • Large Children's Pony

Cross Entry: Rider: Rider age restrictions as found in Regular Pony sections do not apply. Riders may show only one pony in either the 2'0" or the 2'6" height of the Children's Hunter Pony section when also competing in the Regular Small, Medium or Large Pony and/or Green Pony Hunter sections. Riders cannot cross enter into any class where fences exceed 3'3" (exception: Riders may show in Pony Jumpers).

Horse/Pony: Ponies exhibited in Children's Hunter Pony may cross enter into any class where otherwise eligible. **Horse /Rider Combination:** The rider may not show the same pony in the Regular Pony or the Green Pony Divisions. **Note:** The pony may only be shown by one rider in the Children's Hunter Pony Classic and that rider must be declared prior to the first round of the Classic.

Fence Height: • Small/Medium Ponies: 2'0" with spreads not to exceed height of fence.

• Large Ponies: 2'6" with spreads not to exceed height of fence. • In and outs will not be permitted

Combining/Dividing Sections:

The Children's Hunter Pony section may be divided by size. If the Children's Hunter Pony is divided by size it will be divided: Children's Hunter Pony Small/Medium and Children's Hunter Pony Large. If there are fewer than three (3) entries in either height section, the two sections must be combined. The Children's Hunter Pony section may be combined with Low Children's Hunter Pony when there are fewer than three (3) entries in either section. When sections are combined there are more than 24 total entries, the sections must be divided utilizing a Floating split, or a California split to create an even division of entries.

Low Children's Hunter Pony

Individual classes may be entered. (Exception: Under Saddle classes. See HU129.2), Low Children's Hunter Ponies are not required to jog for soundness.

Cross Entry: Riders: Low Children's Hunter Pony Riders may not cross enter into any class with fence heights that exceed 2'9" or into the Children's Hunter Pony, Pony Hunter, or Green Pony Hunter Section at the same competition. **Pony:** Ponies exhibiting in Low Children's Hunter Pony may cross enter into any class where otherwise eligible.

Horse/Rider Combination: The Rider may not show the same pony in the Regular Small, Medium or Large Pony, Green Pony Hunter and/or Children's Hunter Pony sections. A pony may only be shown by one rider in the Low Children's Hunter Pony Division. In the Low Children's Hunter Pony Classic, the Classic rider must be declared prior to the first round of the Classic.

Fence Height: • 2'0"

Combining/Dividing: Combining: If there are fewer than three (3) ponies in the Low Children's Hunter Pony section, they may combine with the Children's Hunter Pony Section.

Dividing: Low Children's Hunter Pony may be divided if there are more than 20 entries in the Division.

Rider: Any competitor that competes in any class set at over 1.25m is ineligible to compete in a Junior Jumper class set below 1.20m at that competition.

Horse and Rider Combination: 1.00/1.05m Junior Jumper horse/rider combinations may not cross enter into any classes held above 1.15m at the same show. 1.00/1.05m Junior Jumper horse/rider combinations may enter only one classic, if both 1.00/1.05m and 1.10/1.15m are offered. 1.10/1.15m Junior Jumper horse/rider combinations are not permitted to cross enter into Junior Jumper classes or any class at 1.20m and above that offers prize money, at the same competition. 1.10/1.15m Junior Jumper horse/rider combinations may enter only one classic, if both 1.00/1.05m and 1.10/1.15m are offered.

Fence Height: • Junior Jumper 1.00m to 1.05m • Junior Jumper 1.10m to 1.15m

Combining/Dividing Sections: 1.00/1.05m Junior Jumper and 1.10/1.15m Junior Jumper sections may be divided or combined with 1.00/1.05m Amateur Jumper and 1.10/1.15m Amateur Jumper sections, at management's discretion, if so stated in the prize list.

Awards: Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following section:

- 1.00/1.05m Junior Jumper section
- 1.10/1.15m Junior Jumper section


