The South Downs National Park is home to incredibly beautiful landscapes, rare habitats and wildlife. But even here nature is under pressure and needs our help.

About 25% of the National Park is managed for nature. In 2021, we launched our ReNature campaign with the goal of raising £100m to increase that to 33% by 2030. This will add an extra 13,000 hectares managed for nature. That is an area three times the size of Portsmouth. We don't want to stop there - we want the remaining 67% to be nature friendly too.

Join us this July to celebrate the stunning wildlife found here in the South Downs National Park, From guided walks to volunteering, scything to butterfly identifying - we have something for everyone during our 2023 ReNature Festival
