The University of Divinity is a collegiate university strengthened and shaped by its many partnerships. Together we empower our learning community to address the issues of the contemporary world through critical engagement with Christian theological traditions.

Libraries affiliated with the University and its Colleges are critical to the University's mission. Their combined collections, together with the online resources available via the University's Library Hub, provide access to an extensive range of resources that support excellence in learning, teaching and research.

All members of the University are eligible to access and borrow from all *University of Divinity Libraries*. Contact individual libraries for opening hours and access arrangements.

University of Divinity Libraries

A University Libraries Agreement was established in December 2018. All University of Divinity Libraries are included in this brochure. This includes all libraries that are either signatories to the University Libraries Agreement or that are listed on a Collegiate Agreement.

All **members of the University** are entitled to access and borrow from all *University of Divinity Libraries*, to access the University Library Hub, and to receive a University ID Card. Access to collections, including borrowing rights, are subject to reasonable constraints which may be imposed by each library. Contact individual libraries for opening hours and access arrangements.

Library Hub

The **Library Hub** provides access to an extensive range of online resources (databases, ejournals and eBooks) and a wealth of other library-related information. It is an online one-stop shop for all things “library”, providing links to many useful tools and resources, including academic resources, library special collections, FAQs, and a range of general and subject-based LibGuides.

The single search bar on the Library Hub enables you to search across all of the Library Hub’s electronic resources as well as the print holdings of the University of Divinity Libraries that contribute to the shared catalogue. By using the filters on the left you can limit your search results to a single library, or expand it to include University of Divinity Libraries or Libraries Worldwide. This search functionality is based on WorldCat, the world’s most comprehensive library database, enabling users to identify resources held in library collections around the world.

For libraries that also participate in the University’s shared library management system, live availability data will also display in search results.

If a book or article in your search results says it is available at University of Divinity Libraries but does not display the name of the library, click on the item, scroll down and click on the “Other Libraries Worldwide” button. This will bring up holdings information for other libraries, including the University of Divinity Libraries that contribute to the shared system. Because the default display order is based on distance from East Melbourne, most University of Divinity Libraries will appear towards the top of the list. Reciprocal Borrowing

All members of the University also have reciprocal borrowing rights at the University of Melbourne. Borrowing privileges do not include access to the University of Melbourne’s online databases from outside of the University library branches. Members of the University of Divinity need to enrol as borrowers of the University of Melbourne by going to the Baillieu Library and presenting their current UD staff or student card.

Adelaide Theological Library

Uniting College for Leadership and Theology

The Adelaide Theological Library (ATL) supports the teaching and research of the Uniting College of Leadership and Theology and includes the associate members of SCMOI and Dayspring WA. The ATL opened in 1997 to service the students and staff of the Adelaide College of Divinity (ACD). It holds a strong ecumenical collection based on Uniting Church, Anglican and Catholic traditions, and was developed from the combined collections of Parkin-Wesley College, St. Francis Xavier Seminary, St. Barnabas' Theological College and the Society of the Sacred Mission (Adelaide).

Collection strengths and specialties: Over 56,000 book titles in Christian Leadership, Biblical Studies, Church History, Pastoral Care, Systematic Theology, Christian Spirituality, Ministry Practice, Missiology, Feminist Theology and an increasing collection of titles on Australian Aboriginal, Asian and Pacific theologies.

Special Collections: The library has a collection of over 500 rare books. This collection comprises of books on the early development of the Methodist and other churches in Australia, church missions, early Bibles, hymn books and psalters, sermons, church magazines, and early South Australian history. The Hymnbook collection is of significant historical value and reflects the changing theology and language of worship. The collection is interdenominational, although largely Protestant and contains hymnals, psalters, hymnology, theology of hymns and other vocal music used in public worship.

St Barnabas College provides a resource base to staff, students, clergy, and the community through library collections. The library, previously held at Belair, was re-established in North Adelaide through a generous donation in 2015. Students and staff of the University of Divinity partner colleges located in Adelaide will need to register to borrow by visiting the library. For higher degree by research (HDR) students and staff located interstate, items can be borrowed by submitting requests through their home library.

Collection strengths and specialties: Over 30,000 books on subjects ranging from philosophy through to history, with the major focus being on religion and theology. There is also a Rare book collection which belonged to the original St Barnabas College library.

The Carmelite Library

Carmelite Province of Australia-Timor Leste

The Carmelite Library was started in the 1930s when the Carmelites founded their monastery in Donvale. The change in policy focus to specialising in Spirituality and Mysticism came before the Library was shifted to Middle Park in 2002. It is the leading library of its kind in Australia. As well as serving the University of Divinity, the Carmelite Library has many members for whom spiritual reading is a matter of lifelong learning.

Collection strengths and specialties: The collection of about 50,000 monographs and journals has research strengths in: Spirituality, Mysticism, Carmeliteana, Monasticism and religious orders, Mariology, Hagiography.

Dalton McCaughey Library

Pilgrim Theological College | Trinity College Theological School

The Library integrates collections owned by the Australian Jesuits and the Victorian and Tasmanian Synod of the Uniting Church. The library houses and maintains collections that have been important to theological scholarship in Victoria since its formation at Ormond College at the University of Melbourne in 1971. Its collection of printed and electronic books and journals numbers over 250,000 making it one of the largest theological collections in Australia.

Collection strengths and specialties: DML's collection is distinctively ecumenical and research orientated with a range of strengths in Biblical studies, theology, church work, history and philosophy. It holds special collections on the Church Fathers, Jesuit history and spirituality, and the Uniting Church and its denominational history. It is the deposit library for the printed copies of University of Divinity theses.

Mannix Library

Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne | Catholic Theological College

Mannix Library provides access to over 140,000 print and over 600,000 non-book materials, including journals, eBooks and open access items. Founded in 1923 the library supports teaching and research in theology, philosophy and a range of associated disciplines, with an emphasis on the Catholic tradition. The library welcomes students and staff from the wider University of Divinity community and also provides library services to subscribed members of the general public. The Mannix Library catalogue also provides access to the resources of the St Mary's Seminary Library, the collection of the Oblates of Mary Immaculate (OMI).

Collection strengths and specialties: Philosophy, Biblical Studies, Systematic Theology, Church History, Patristics, Moral Theology and Canon Law, Pastoral Studies.

Special Collections: Rare Books (including Early Imprints and Incunabula), the Catholic Heritage and Hibernica (Irish history and literature) collections, Corpus Christianorum, Migne's Patrologia Latina and Patrologia Graeca, Delphin Latin Classics, an Antiquities collection of coins and artefacts, the Knights of Malta Collection, the ISCAST Science and Religion Collection, and the Archbishop's Library (including a separate Archbishop J.A. Goold Collection).

St Paschal Library

Franciscan Order of Friars Minor, Province of the Holy Spirit | Yarra Theological Union

St Paschal Library is the main resource centre for Franciscan studies within Australia. Its comprehensive collection of Catholic theological material is also available to faculty and students from the University of Divinity. As well as the friars' own resources, St Paschal Library houses two additional collections: in 1988 the Divine Word Missionaries (SVD) placed their missiology collection (currently around 3500 books) into the St Paschal Library; and in 1995 the Yarra Theological Union library collection (currently around 4900 books) was similarly integrated.

Heart of Life's library of spirituality resources is accessible online via the St Paschal Library catalogue and University of Divinity Library Hub websites.

Collection strengths and specialties: The collection of around 56,000 monographs and 150 journal titles is strong in: Ancient and classical languages, Art history and spirituality, Catholic theology, Missiology, Patristic and medieval studies.

Special collections: Franciscana, Celsus Kelly Collection on Spanish and Portuguese discoveries of the Pacific, Pre-Vatican II Canon Law collection, rare books.
