RDU International Airport offers 400 daily flights arriving from 66 nonstop destinations, both domestic and international. Nearly 10 million passengers land here annually.


RESEARCH TRIANGLE PARK AREA

Durhamites have invented the barcode, BC Headache Power, AZT, 3-D ultrasound, Astroturf, and LED lighting. Durham is home to science and learning every day — of course we have things for visitors to do and learn. Spark your curiosity at the nationally recognized **Museum of Life + Science**, **Duke** Lemur Center **E1**, and Research Triangle Park. Durham is also replete with natural beauty that must be experienced to be appreciated. Nature aficionados can take in the Sarah P. **Duke Gardens C7**, as well as hiking trails and scenic river views at the Eno River State Park or Lake Michie.



Historic Sites & Museums

What began as the home of two Native Americans tribes continues as a destination praised for its work in technology, education and healthcare. It is of little surprise that Durham's past is eventful and noteworthy. We have three state historic sites here, more than any other county in N.C. - Historic Stagville, Bennett Place, and Duke Homestead - with other enclaves of storytelling like **Museum of Durham History D12**. History buffs, come ready to explore: from historic tobacco mills revitalized in our urban core to preserved homesteads sharing lessons from the past, you're invited to travel through our time.

Here, muralists create treasured masterpieces on our brickladen facades, galleries can be perused at your own leisure, and iron wrought sculptures serve as time capsules. Art and culture course through Durham's soul; we are home to immigrantcreated exhibits, historical stages and spectacular festivals. Sports & Recreation




